Often tragic events or difficult times leave us wondering, "Why would God allow this?" "Did God cause this?" "Is God really a loving Father?"

We are told that God is good, and we know that He is all-powerful, because that's part of the definition of being God. We also observe that there is substantial suffering in the world. Tragedies and other events occur which cause pain and suffering for people.

We cannot deny the existence of suffering, so we wonder if God is really good or if God is really all-powerful. It seems to us that if God is good, then He would certainly use His power to prevent these things from happening, and if He is all-powerful, His goodness would certainly move Him to intervene. This leaves us to wonder how we can reconcile our experience of suffering with the fact of God's power and goodness.

The trouble is that we do not know all things, but only know as much about God as He has chosen to reveal. We know that trouble is the fault of sin's general effect on the world that things no longer work as they should. Although we see incidents of God's miraculous intervention to relieve suffering recorded in Scripture, and perhaps anecdotal reports in present days, we also have no promise that He will always do so, and we observe that He ordinarily does not (thus the times He does being noteworthy).

More importantly, though, we know that He has revealed Himself to humanity through the life of Jesus and the other events of the Bible foretelling and proclaiming His life, death, and resurrection. Even though He has not revealed the inner workings of His mind or the reasoning behind His ways, He has demonstrated His goodness to us in Jesus.

This is where we look for Hope. He chose not to immediately inflict upon humanity the well-deserved punishment for our sin, but He Himself came down to be our substitute in suffering death and condemnation. By this, He demonstrates His goodness to us, and if He has intervened in this self-sacrificing way on our behalf, we can certainly trust that He will do all things for our good. While we may not understand events in the moment, we know that He is for us and not against us because of what we have witnessed in Jesus.

We know that the suffering of this world is only for a time but that He and His promises are eternal, so we look forward with anticipation for the day when He will put an end to the suffering of this world by making all things new in a creation that will forever be free from sin and the suffering it brings.

Messiah Updates for June

WORSHIP UPDATE: Our summer schedule has begun!

- From Sunday, May 30th (Memorial Day weekend) through Sunday, September 5th (Labor Day weekend), there will be one worship service held at 10:00 am. This service will also be livestreamed at

- Adult Bible Class will be held at 9:00 am from Sunday, June 6th through Sunday, August 29th; Sunday School and LifeLight will be in recess for the summer. We are working on arrangements to have Adult Bible Class livestreamed as well.
- Monday night services will also be held from Monday, June 7th through Monday, August 30th at 7:00 pm. (One exception: there will be no evening service on Monday, July 5th.)

At their May meetings, Messiah's Board of Elders and Church Council approved the following changes to our *In-Person Worship Guidelines*:

- The Council approved the exemption of those who are fully vaccinated from wearing face coverings, effective immediately. (Those who are not medically able to tolerate a face covering are also exempt.)
- The Elders approved the following changes, effective **Sunday, May 30**th:
 - Resuming the use of hymnals and fellowship pads.
 - Hymns will no longer be printed in the regular service folder; printing of all other worship elements in the service folder will continue.
 - Extra copies of the large print service folder will be printed for those who prefer not to use hymnals at this time. (We will also resume printing an insert with weekly prayer requests, announcements and upcoming events.)
 - Congregants should take service folders with them for reference, then recycle or discard them at home.
- When Holy Communion is offered, revised distribution protocols will be in use:
 - The Pastor and Elders involved in distribution will continue to wear masks and gloves.
 - 4-6 individuals (2-3 households) will be ushered forward to each half of the communion rail at a time, in order to maintain social distancing.
 - o Communicants may kneel or stand.
 - o Communicants will receive the Body of Christ in their open hand from the Elder.
 - Communicants will take an individual cup from the tray held by the Pastor to receive the Blood of Christ.
 - Communicants will place the empty cup in the slot on the communion rail.

 Communicants who prefer to receive the Sacrament in the pews will be asked to notify the Elder or Ushers before the service begins.

You can find the complete revised *Worship Guidelines* on the front page of <u>www.messiahgr.org</u>. We anticipate that the Elders and Council will take up the State of Michigan's scheduled lifting of COVID-19 restrictions at their June meetings.

BUILDING USE UPDATE: Please note that Messiah's staff will return to regular onsite office hours on **Tuesday, June 1st**. We ask that those who are not fully vaccinated continue to wear face coverings while interacting with others in the building, and that everyone would continue to observe indoor gathering size limits and social distancing during the coming month, unless otherwise noted.

A MESSAGE FROM MESSIAH'S PRESIDENT

Dear faithful Members of Messiah,

Our pastoral vacancy began over 2 years ago. We have placed 8 calls and had 8 calls returned. God was preparing our hearts for the man he had already chosen. The wait is nearly over. Our assigned seminarian Andrew Twietmeyer graduated on May 21; Synod will officially approve him for ministry at our congregation in the near future.

In anticipation of Pastor-Elect Twietmeyer's arrival, we as the Council are preparing for his ordination service. We ask you to save the date of **Saturday**, **June 19**th as the likely date we will hold this service. We want to warmly receive him and hold a social gathering (outdoors if weather permits) after the service.

Ordination of a pastor into the ministry is a sacred event and many of Pastor Twietmeyer's family as well as local pastors will want to be in attendance. We also want as many of our congregation to be able to attend as possible. In light of these circumstances we are planning for a high attendance at this service.

The guidelines set out by the State of Michigan have exempted churches from gathering size limits for some time now; Messiah's Elders and Church Council had chosen to be more safety conscious than these guidelines have required. For this special service we will modify the seating arrangements to accommodate the larger expected crowd size. We want to do this while still providing areas for those who are continuing to wear masks and socially distance.

The sanctuary seating will not be socially distanced and all of the pews will be open. There will be areas in the narthex that will have seating that will be distanced as well as a live stream broadcast that will be shown in the fellowship hall and on the internet.

So we can plan well for all of the above, we will be asking you to RSVP for the ordination service and the social gathering. We will share fuller details once the date and time of the service have been confirmed.

Please feel free to contact me if you have questions. Praise God that he has brought us through this time and now we are joyfully looking forward to receiving our new shepherd.


