One of the more fun parts about being the pastor here at Messiah is the view out my office window. A few times a week I get to watch as the preschool children head out to recess. One day it dawned upon me that the image of children running out to the playground is a perfect picture of what the resurrection will be like.

Sprung from the confines of the classroom, voices are raised, feet pound, legs run, and the breath of life fills the lungs of these little ones. Recess, for the child, brings nothing less than exultant joy. That's a fun thought. To quote one of my favorite characters (Long John Silver), from one of my favorite books (Treasure Island), "It's a pleasant thing to be young, and have ten toes, and you may lay to that." Most people who have a lot of miles on the odometer can relate to the vicarious satisfaction of watching a child play and run and jump and roll and generally do things that would cause us older and rounder folks a great deal of pain and soreness the next day. And so, the soul groans, knowing that those days are gone.

However, our Lord teaches us that those days are not necessarily over, for there will be a resurrection. God is not the God of the dead, but of the living. What this means is that eternal life will not be a realm filled with bodiless souls, nor will it be a place where believers grow wings and become angels. Instead, the faithful in heaven will have legs that run, lips that sing, and lungs which breathe. These won't be just any old legs, lips, and lungs though, but it will be the imperishable version of our current bodies: a resurrected body. God is not only going to reset the odometer on these bodies of ours, but He will restore them their vintage state, a state in which we, being conceived in sin, have never yet existed. Cartlidge will return, spinal discs won't be stacked one on top of another, torn ligaments will be renewed, and mental faculties will be restored. Not only that, but tongues will be loosed to sing the praises of the Lamb and ears will be opened to hear His eternal Gospel.

Therefore, this month as we dwell upon the resurrection of Jesus, let us look forward to our own resurrection, which will be like His. Let's look forward to being sprung from our tombs and running and singing and breathing the breath of life anew. When we see youth and vigor and life, rather than lamenting age and its toll on our bodies we can set our hopes on our future resurrection in which all the affects of age will be reversed by the Holy Spirit.

**LENT AND HOLY WEEK WORSHIP:** Our midweek Lenten services continue **through Wednesday, April 6**<sup>th</sup>. We'll conclude our focus on the six chief parts of the Christian faith as explained in Martin Luther's Small Catechism:

- Wednesday, March 30<sup>th</sup> Confession and Absolution (John 13:36-38)
- Wednesday, April 6<sup>th</sup> The Lord's Supper (John 17:1-26)

Then comes Holy Week, the climax of this season, when we especially ponder Jesus' suffering, death and resurrection:

- Palm Sunday/The Sunday of the Passion, April 10<sup>th</sup>, 8:30 & 11:00 am Divine Service with the Procession of Palms, the Passion History and Holy Communion.
- Holy Thursday, April 14<sup>th</sup>, 7:00 pm Divine Service with Holy Communion and the Stripping of the Altar.
- Good Friday, April 15<sup>th</sup> Chief Service at 11:00 am (note the time change from previous years); Service of Darkness (Tenebrae Vespers) at 7:00 pm.
- Easter Sunday, April 17<sup>th</sup>, 7:30 and 10:30 am Divine Service (note the time change)

Let us pray that our dear Father in heaven, for the sake of His beloved Son and in the power of His Holy Spirit, might richly bless the rest of this Lententide for us, so that we may come to Easter with glad hearts, and keep the feast of our resurrected Lord Jesus in sincerity and truth!
