"For among us masses are celebrated every Lord's Day and on the other festivals, in which the Sacrament is offered to those who wish to use it, after they have been examined and absolved. And the usual public ceremonies are observed, the series of lessons, of prayers, vestments, and other like things." This quotation from the Apology (defense) of the Augsburg Confession gives us a look into the worship life during the times of Martin Luther and Phillip Melanchthon, who was the author of this quote. Now, don't let the word "masses" scare you. Mass is simply another word for what we call the "divine service." So it is that on every Sunday and on festivals (such as Christmas, Easter, Ascension, etc.) the first Lutherans continued to do what the church had been doing since the start: they worshipped and offered communion.

So, we must ask ourselves, why do we not do this? Well, here is where a bit of history is helpful. In North America, there were relatively few Lutherans to begin with, as a majority of the immigration was from countries that were not predominantly Lutheran. So it was that Lutherans have always been a minority on this continent. For however few Lutherans there were, though, there were even fewer Lutheran pastors. It became a common practice, therefore, for a Lutheran pastor to travel from place to place and serve multiple congregations. What this meant was that most congregations only would gather with a called and ordained pastor once a month or even less frequently. So it was that communion would only be celebrated when the pastor was in town. This practice remained common in much of the country even until the late 19th century.

Since that time though, Lutheran churches with a pastor in the chancel every Sunday have begun to return to our Biblical heritage by celebrating the Lord's Supper every Lord's Day. Weekly Communion, as it is sometimes referred to, is now a much more common practice in the LCMS. More importantly though, it is a Biblical practice. The Lord's Supper is the pinnacle of the Divine Service, for it is then that we have a personal encounter with the flesh and blood of Jesus Christ, who died on the cross to redeem us from sin, death, and the devil. The absolution, the readings of the scriptures, and the preached sermon all lead us to Jesus. For us, Jesus is found in the Supper.

The Board of Elders and I have been spending time studying this topic in the Scriptures and learning about our heritage. Because of this, we are all in agreement that this would be a great thing to bring to

Messiah. So, in September, we will begin having the Lord's Supper every Lord's Day. It will be a wonderful joy to receive Jesus' body and blood with you every week and I pray that it is a joy for you as well.

Jesus Christ, in his body and blood, is our sure defense against the devil and all his ways. The world is continually pitted against us, so let us make Christ our foundation every week. As Luther once wrote, "If you could see how many daggers, spears, and arrows are aimed at you every moment, you would be glad to come to the sacrament as often as you can." Therefore, let us take refuge in Jesus, for though He comes to us in humble bread and wine, He comes to us with all authority in heaven and on earth to forgive our sins and defend us from all evil.

#### From the Parish Assistant

#### **CALLING ALL SINGERS!**

"I will give thanks to you, O Lord, among the peoples; I will sing praises to you among the nations." (Psalm 108:3)

When we gather for worship, God lovingly serves us through His Holy Word and Sacraments. Responding to God's love, we use His gift of music to pray, praise, proclaim and recount the story of His grace in song! (See Colossians 3:12-17.)

Messiah's music makers lead and support our musical praises in worship – and our primary instrument is the human voice! As we gear up for the coming year of activity, you can help lead worship by participating in the *Senior Choir*.

#### From the Parish Assistant, continued:

The Senior Choir is active on two Sundays per month (usually once at 8:30 am and once at 11 am); the choir helps introduce new hymns, leads service music, and sings anthems that respond to the Scripture lessons. They also sing for festivals (Reformation, Thanksgiving Eve, Christmas Eve, the Transfiguration of our Lord, Easter, Pentecost) and other special services (such as our annual Ascension service with St. Peter-Rockford). Weekly choir practices resume **Wednesday**, **September 7**<sup>th</sup>, **lasting from 7:00 pm to 8:15 pm.**

**WORSHIP IN AUGUST:** as the Time of the Church continues, our readings from the Gospel of Luke tell of Jesus' continuing ministry, focusing on His "hard sayings" that are pre-echoed in our Old Testament readings. The Epistle readings zero in on chapters 11-13 of the letter to the Hebrews, tracking God's faithfulness to His Old Testament people all the way through to Jesus, "the founder and perfecter of our faith" (Hebrews 12:2). Our altar, pulpit and lectern paraments remain green, symbolizing the rich pastures of our Good Shepherd's Word and Sacraments.

During August, we will pray Divine Service, Setting One from *Lutheran Service Book* at communion services. Matins and the Service of Prayer and Preaching will be used on non-communion Sundays; we'll pray the spoken Prayer at the Close of the Day for our August 15<sup>th</sup> Monday night service. With the Lord's Supper being offered every Sunday beginning in September (see Pastor's article elsewhere in this newsletter), we will be pursuing other opportunities to continue using these prayer services, as well as the services of Vespers and Evening Prayer, during the coming months.

Our new hymn for August & September will be "Triune God, Be Thou Our Stay," number 505 in *Lutheran Service Book*. Martin Luther adapted this medieval processional song, changing its original words (which invoked various saints) to a clear confession of God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit and publishing it in the first Lutheran hymnal of 1524. As Great Britain's interest in German culture peaked during the reign of Queen Victoria and Prince Albert, English poet Richard Massie translated this and other Luther hymns into English, publishing a selection in 1854. We hope you enjoy learning and singing it, beginning on **Sunday, August 14**th.

In the month to come, we pray that your hearing of God's Word and partaking of the Lord's Supper at Messiah will strengthen your faith, empowering you to share Christ's love with the people in your life!

#### AUGUST LWML MISSION HIGHLIGHT & NEW LWML MICHIGAN DISTRICT MITE GOAL

Deaconesses are continually pointing those they serve to the cross, sharing the Gospel with them. What is a deaconess? She is professional church worker trained to share the gospel of Christ. This month's LWML Mission Grant, "Caring for and Sharing Christ with Hurting People" provides scholarships to women studying on site at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis or Fort Wayne, or those studying remotely with Center for Hispanic Studies, Ethnic Immigrant Institute of Theology. or the newly offered online Deaconess Studies Program. Pick up an LWML Mite Box, put in your coins and dollars to help fund this mission grant, and pray for all our LC-MS women studying to serve God and our church as a deaconess.

Did you know that at the July 7th - 9th LWML Michigan District Convention we approved a 2022 - 2024 Mite Goal of \$386,000? That's right. ALL fourteen mission grants were approved! What were we thinking in our economy's current state of inflation? Only God knows and only He can bless the coins and dollars given to missions in our Mite boxes.

Why not pick up an LWML Mite box at the table in the narthex and place your loose change or dollars in it all year around? Occasionally, empty your Mite Box into the large one in Messiah's narthex and refill yours again. Last year, members of Messiah contributed \$1391.61 for mites.
