



## 2022 Detroit CoC Point-in-Time Count

### Summary Data Report

The Detroit Continuum of Care (CoC), the Homeless Action Network of Detroit (HAND), and the City of Detroit conducted a one-night Point-in-Time count of persons who were experiencing homelessness in the cities of Detroit, Hamtramck, and Highland Park on January 26, 2022. The Point-in-Time count (PIT) provides a snapshot of the number of persons experiencing homelessness in our community on this one night. This report provides an overview of the data from the 2022 PIT which includes both Sheltered and Unsheltered populations.
