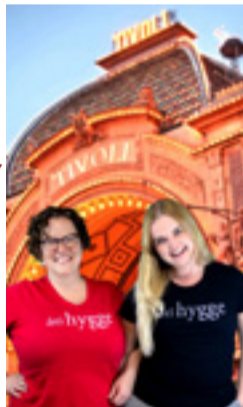

THE DANISH WINDMILL

Hours 8 a.m.-7 p.m.

Tour the historic 1848 Danish Windmill celebrating 44 years in America. This majestic mill was built in 1848 in Nørre Snede, Denmark, and brought to America in 1975. It was rebuilt in Elk Horn by community volunteers to honor the area's strong Danish heritage. Be sure to visit the VikingHjem, Morning Star Chapel, and now the Ebeltøft Village. The Mill is celebrating the completion of a two year restoration project.

The VikingHjem is a typical structure used throughout Scandinavia and Northern Europe during the latter Dark Ages to the early Middle ages. Experience the life of a Viking Smithy in 900 A.D. from the blacksmith shop and woodworking area to the ax throwing demonstrations and lectures. **NEW** this year is Wire weaving-Originally called Sølvrådsfletning (translating to silver wire braid in Danish) this ancient way of weaving wire into beautiful ropes of jewelry dates back to the 1st century.

Jacob Riis: How the Other Half Lives: Danish immigrant Jacob Riis was a pioneering photojournalist and social reformer. He brought attention to the slums of New York City in the late 1800s, inspiring reforms that set better standards for housing and hygiene. His photographs were the first to document living conditions among the urban poor, most of whom were recent immigrants.

Vessel: Ceramic Art by Michael Geertsen and Morten Løbner Espersen: These two contemporary artists push the boundaries of traditional ceramic vessels. Each of them displays extraordinary craftsmanship while expressing their artistic vision, from the forms to the finishing glazes.

Dannebrog – The Banner of the Danes: This year marks the 800th anniversary since Denmark adopted its red and white flag, known as Dannebrog. Learn about the legend, history, and current use of the flag in Danish culture.

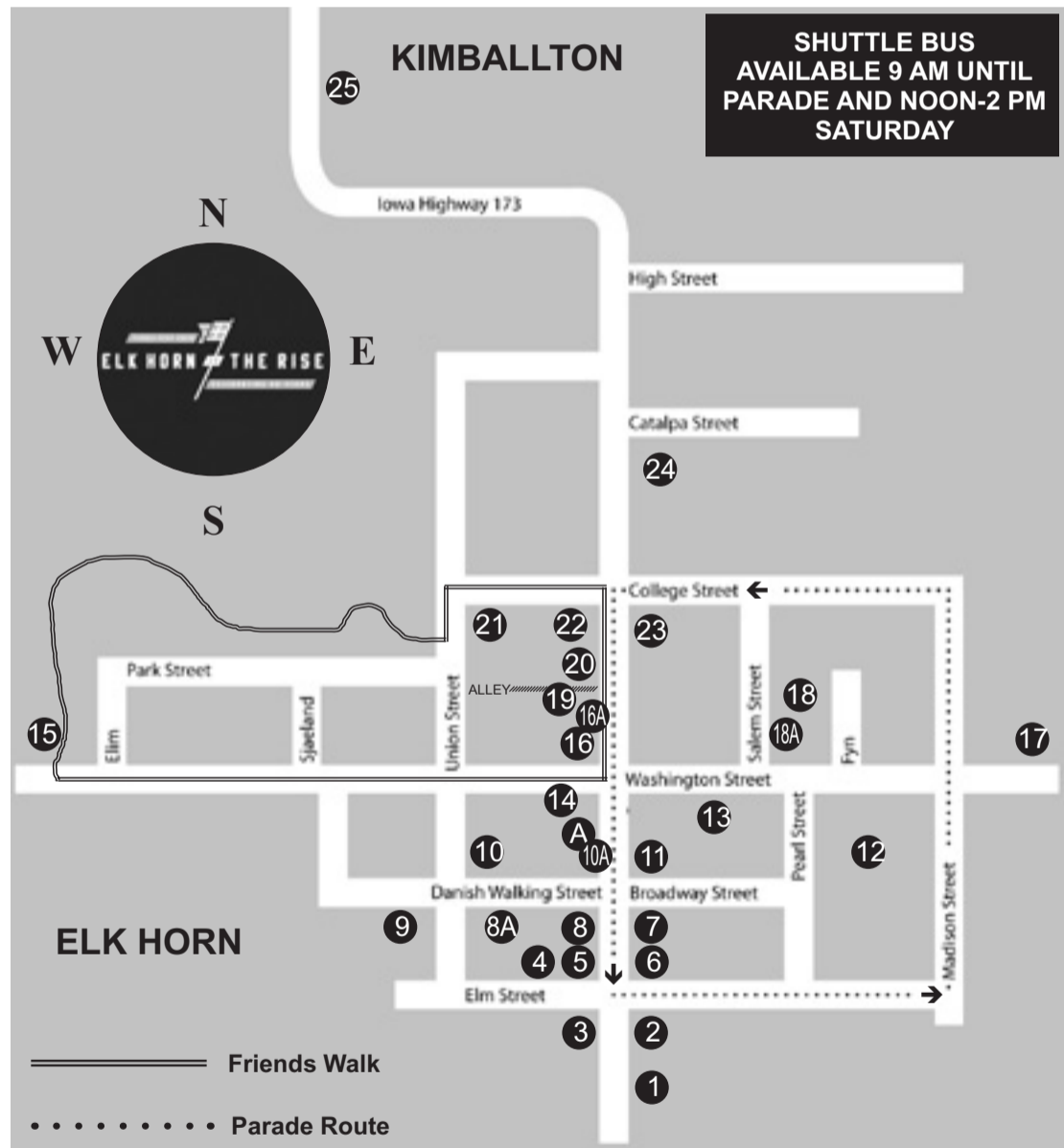
