

Subject Area	Autumn 1 Topic/ Focus Question Let's Explore (mini topic) Get Back in Your Swamp!
English	Fiction- Story-telling for Writing- The Enormous Crocodile by Roald Dahl.
Maths	Children will be working on the following key areas: Place Value Addition and subtraction (Yr1-to 20 and Yr 2-to 100)-lots of practical grouping and counting of real objects, using words such as: more, less, between , comes after, and fewer. Reading, writing and ordering these numbers. Practising recording additions and subtractions as number sentences.
Topic	Linked Questions/areas of work <u>Let's Explore!</u> Comparative study of the explorers: Captain Cook, Tim Peake & Amy Johnson, linked to new class names. <u>Get Back in Your Swamp!</u> Children learn about what jungles are and where in the world they are found. They investigate which animals are found in and around jungles, sorting them into the 5 animal groups (reptiles, amphibians, birds, fish and mammals) They are introduced to food chains and describe simple ones. They design and make a new swamp for the Enormous Crocodile, taking into account habitat features needed for the animals that live there.
