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PART A: RATIONALE:

It is compulsory for students at Victor Harbor High School to wear school uniform at all times. Students need to present themselves in a manner which indicates that they are at school for the purpose of learning. Under the EDUCATION ACT (1972) and REGULATION 86 school councils have the power to:

- Determine school dress policy.
- Enforce uniform obligations and exemption conditions.

The school uniform has been determined through a consultative process, involving the Governing Council, staff, students and parents. School uniform is important because:

- It creates a positive image of the school particularly in the community, developing and maintaining a high standard of appearance.
- It encourages a sense of belonging and pride in our school.
- It easily identifies our students on school grounds and in the community, which is important for student safety.
- It helps create a more equitable social environment.
- It is practical and includes 'safe' clothing for all subjects.

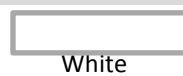
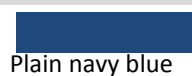
PART B: UNIFORM IMPLEMENTATION:

All students must be in full uniform at all times.

1. In situations of financial hardship, arrangements will be made by the school counsellors and/or the principal, to supply students with correct uniform.
2. On those occasions when it is not possible for a student to comply with the uniform requirements, a written note must be provided (diary or email) and shown to the student's Mentor teacher. This is a valid *exemption* on the day it is received by the Mentor teacher. Students will be expected to show evidence of this exemption when requested by staff.
3. New students may be exempt from wearing school uniform until they can purchase one. This will be negotiated between the family and the enrolling staff before the student starts.
4. Students may also be exempt from wearing school uniform due to health reasons.
 - a. On these occasions, families should contact the school and students are still expected to be dressed appropriately for school, in school colours (navy blue, grey and white).
5. Families will be notified on those occasions when uniforms are not required, for example camps or student casual days.

PART C: UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS:

1. School colours are navy blue, grey and white.



2. Polo shirts

- a. Plain navy blue, with white side stripes OR white with blue sides and school logo on front, as supplied by Totally Work Wear Victor Harbor.
- b. Sky blue polo for Physical Education.
- c. Pathway and team polo shirts – all (future) tops will be plain navy blue, with white sides (as existing school polo) or white, with plain navy blue sides (in reverse of existing school polo) with printing on the back and school logo on the front. These must be organised through the Uniform Committee.
- d. All school polos, except for PE tops, must have a school logo.

3. Jumpers and Windcheaters

- a. Plain navy blue V-neck wool jumper, with logo on front, as supplied by Totally Work Wear Victor Harbor.
- b. Plain navy blue hoodie with logo on front, as supplied by Totally Work Wear Victor Harbor.

- c. Pathway and team windcheaters should be the same style as the existing plain navy blue school windcheater, with printing on the back and school logo on the front. These must be organised through the Uniform Committee via the school's Facilities and Physical Resources Manager.
- d. Year 12 top, in school colours, as organised by the school via the school's Facilities and Physical Resources Manager.

4. Shorts

- a. Plain navy blue or grey – thin white side stripes or piping and small logo are acceptable.
 - i. These must be no shorter than mid-thigh length.

5. Pants

- a. Plain navy blue or grey pants, trousers or track pants - thin white stripes or piping, and small logo, are acceptable.
 - i. Denim and black pants/leggings are **not** part of the school's dress code.


6. Dress

- a. Summer – Blue and white check dress, as supplied by Totally Work Wear Victor Harbor.
 - i. no shorter than mid-thigh length.
- b. Winter – Tartan skirt, as supplied by the Totally Work Wear Victor Harbor, worn with navy tights or white or navy socks.
 - i. No shorter than mid-thigh length.

7. Special uniforms

- a. Tops for sporting teams will be supplied on loan by the school for individual events, and will be navy blue and/or white.
- b. Music uniform – plain navy blue trousers and specialist navy blue polo top (see Part C, 2c).
- c. Formal uniform including a blazer and tie is expected to be worn at special events as deemed appropriate by staff.
 - i. Blazers and ties can be loaned from the school via Student Services.

8. Other clothing and accessories

- a. Beanies and scarves, in school colours, may be worn in winter, and if requested will be removed in class.
- b. Sun glasses, hats and sunscreen are recommended for all outdoor activities exceeding 15mins duration.
 - i. It is recommended students choose sunglasses that wrap around the eyes and don't let light in around the frames, especially at the sides, with frames fitting close to the face.
 - ii. It is recommended category two, three or four and/or a lens description that states "good UV protection". Category zero and one are fashion glasses and provide only some UV protection. Polarised lenses reduce glare.
- c. During PE classes, baseball caps may be worn where a broad brimmed or bucket hat may be impractical.
 
- d. It is important to choose a maximum protection sunscreen, so look for one that is labelled SPF 30+ and broad spectrum.

9. Footwear

- a. In practical lessons, fully enclosed flat shoes are required at all times to meet safety standards.
- b. Inappropriate shoes are ugg boots, thongs, backless footwear and heeled shoes.
- c. Shoes should be predominantly school colours or black.

10. Jewellery and Makeup

- a. Makeup must be tastefully worn and/or applied and kept to a minimum.
- b. Jewellery will be kept to a minimum for safety reasons.
