Hurricane Harvey Quick Facts

Via Accuweather:

- It has been 56 years since a major hurricane made landfall in Texas before Harvey.
- There were 2,500 distress calls that crews in Houston responded to on the morning of August 27.
- Three-day rainfall total of 24.83 inches in Houston, which makes August 2017 the city's wettest month on record.
- Rainfall total of 16.07 inches in Houston on August 27 is now the single highest daily rainfall total in the city's history.
- 19 tornadoes were reported along the Gulf Coast on August 25 and 26.
- Hurricane Harvey's death toll is currently at 70 people. (Fox News, September 7)
