Interpreting the chart:

- The size of the bubble indicates the employment size (number of jobs).
- The horizontal axis indicates the annual growth rate, or employment change, over the study period. Growth to the right on the graph is positive.
- The vertical axis indicates the concentration of an industry relative to the State. A concentration of 1.0 or higher indicates that the industry is more concentrated in the region than in the State.
- Industries in the right, upper quadrant show growth over the last five years and a higher concentration in the region compared to California.

Industry Study Highlights

▶ An employment concentration higher than 1.0 indicates a region's competitive advantage and an area of specialized economic activity compared to the State. Regional industries that showed an employment concentration of 1.25 or higher are considered heavily concentrated compared to California.

In Siskiyou County, Natural Resources led the industry sectors with a local concentration level of 4.05, while Government saw a local concentration level of 2.09.

▶ Natural Resources was considered a growth industry due to its strong growth rate and its high local and local concentration of 4.05.

▶ Trade, Transportation, and Utilities, Professional and Business Services, and Other Services were considered to be emerging industries due to their significant employment growth throughout the study period.
