### FAMILY MINISTRY NEWS

It's great to be back after a wonderful week of mission work in Asheville. As a group, we experienced many moments last week where we could see God at work. Each night Andy gave us time to share and talk about those moments during our devotion. I watched, listened, and even shared about how I saw God at work in our church family. It was not the work we were doing, it was the formation of relationships. I am not talking about the relationships with those we were serving. These relationships happened and were wonderful. The relationships I am referencing are those that were formed between our members. Our group was a diverse one. I watched those differences fade throughout the week. Our common goal of showing Christ's love to others opened doors between us allowing for meaningful dialog that has laid the foundation for understanding and friendships across generations.

I recently read a blog by Rose Lee-Norman, Associate Pastor of Family Ministry at Sanctuary Covenant Church in Minneapolis, MN.
