

FAMILY MINISTRY NEWS

Several weeks ago, I delivered the Sunday morning message using Deuteronomy 6:4-9 as my scripture. In this text the Israelites are called to pass down their relationship with God to future generations. During my sermon I talked about how this relates to us as a modern church family. I am truly thankful for a church family that I know is there

for my children, but I still struggle with my role as a parent in helping my children find and strengthen their relationship with Christ.

Recently, I began reading *The Legacy Path: Discover Intentional Spiritual Parenting* by Brian Hayes. In this book Hayes defines a legacy as “anything handed down from the past, as from ancestor or predecessor.” He defines path as “a way beaten, formed, or trodden by others.” If we put these together it creates an intentional way to lead our young people to Christ. It is specifically, a path that is laid down by our life and actions. Which brings me back to parenting.

What is my role? Hayes would suggest that I start with Mark 12:29-30. In it Jesus states that we are to love the Lord with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength. Hayes writes that we live in a world of convenient Christianity and if we really want to impart a faith that sticks to our young people we have to change that fact. As the writers of Sticky Faith will attest, our children typically become what they see. Our faith cannot be passive. It has to be important everyday. We cannot compartmentalize Jesus to specific days of the week. The task itself seems overwhelming but if we encourage each other it is more easily accomplished.

At the end of this article I've included a “Sticky Note” for this weeks encouragement to help reinforce faith at home. If you have ideas for other “Sticky Notes” share them with me to help build our community of support. Look for the “Sticky Note” in future TIE articles.

“Sticky Note”

Prioritize a consistent time during the week that you can spend with God. It may be during a 15-minute commute to work or 10 minutes before the kids get up. The “when” does not matter. What matters is that it is intentional time, a time that you can work on making God a priority in your daily life.
