## FAMILY MINISTRY NEWS

For 18 years I was a staff member of a high adventure camp here in Albemarle called Challenge. This program was designed to expose kids ages 9-15 to outdoors skills and to experiences that would push them outside of their comfort zones.

One of the skills I taught during those years was fire-building. We would teach the kids how to construct fires from scratch. There were always debates as to what was the most effective structure to get fires rolling quickly. Teepee. Lean-to. Log cabin.

During my time with Challenge I noticed that there are typically two mistakes people make when building a fire.

First, they do not prepare enough tender to keep the flames going long enough to allow the larger pieces of wood to catch fire. You get a big flame early and then the fire goes out. The key is steadily providing a fuel source that builds the foundation (coal bed) of the fire.

The second big mistake that most people make involves putting too much fuel. Often we think the more wood the better, but here is the thing about combustion, it needs oxygen. If you don't provide spaces for air to get to the flames you will never get a fire started.

This week when I was reading an article Syler Thomas, I was reminded of those times of instruction years ago. He referenced a poem by Judy Brown called "Fire". In the poem she talks about the importance of both fuel and space in growing a fire.

As ministers to our students it is important that we provide a constant supply of appropriate spiritual fuel to help keep their faith fire burning without smothering the flames all together. Ministers, parents and church families, must work together to construct an environment that provides the right amount of support and space for our students. As we begin our new church year I encourage everyone to prayer and explore where you can be a part of our children's and student ministry. Michael
