As Bill Burnside, Christy Brown, Michael Furr and I attended the final Sticky Faith Summit in Pasadena, CA last week, we had a chance to assess our church's progress in placing a higher value on our children, youth and young adults in order for them to develop a life-long faith. We made a list of all of the ways we have shifted to help our children, youth and young adults experience all aspects of church and develop relationship with adults. Let me list just a few of the ways.

Just over the last several months, we saw young ladies invited and made to feel welcome to make dresses with adult women for Operation Christmas Child boxes. Since the beginning of the new church year, we have had middle school and high school students serve on committees and teach in children's Sunday School classes. We've noticed that more adults are able to call children and youth by name in the hallways. We have seen an increase in young families on Wednesday nights and young women who have initiated two fellowship events for women of all ages. These are just a few examples of Sticky Faith principles at work.

There is no doubt we still have a ways to go before Sticky Faith principles become engrained in our DNA. There are many more relationships to be developed across generational lines and faith to be strengthened. What we have learned through the Sticky Faith Cohort are principles we can apply to our church for years to come to help our whole church rise to a higher level of community.

A new Sticky Faith Leadership Team will be developed to help us keep moving in the right direction as we align our strategic plan with Sticky Faith principles. I believe God has much more in store for our congregation as we continue to learn what it means to be an intergenerational church. Thank you for allowing the team to travel across the country to learn from experts and other churches. I look forward to what the future holds for First Baptist.

This Sunday, we will consider the Half Truth: God Said It, I Believe It, That Settles It? We will also gather
