I've recently been reviewing the results from the Growing Young survey that we completed several weeks ago. Your responses have helped me gain a better understanding of our church family. One of the values expressed in the survey was empathy. Specifically, empathizing with younger generations. Fuller University found that young people today struggle with three general questions: Who am I? Where do I fit in? What difference do I make? As a supportive, intergenerational church we can work together to create an environment where emerging adults can discover the answers to these questions. Seeking a different perspective and simply looking at something in a different way will help us on this journey of understanding and sharing together. Over the next couple of weeks, I will be highlighting more of the core values that were assessed in the survey.
