From the Desk of Andy Jung...

At the beginning of May, First Baptist entered into a partnership with Habitat for Humanity of Stanly County to build their 50th home in our community. We committed \$30,000, which will be matched by Thrivent Financial's Faith Build Grant. We also committed at least 750 volunteer hours to help build the home. To date, we have received approximately 40 commitment cards with **\$23,500** pledged and over **1,000** volunteer hours committed! We are short of our financial goal so if you have not had a chance to turn in your commitment card, please drop it by the church office.

I am constantly amazed at the level of generosity of our church. Generosity is measured by more than just money. I am thrilled that we are willing to roll up our sleeves and get our hands dirty for the sake of the kingdom. I am encouraged by the spirit in which you are willing to give. To be sure, the financial gifts are important for the sake of this ministry but we value the volunteer hours just as much!

Habitat for Humanity is working to prepare the building site for groundbreaking. As soon as the groundbreaking date is set, we will schedule a 3-Day Extreme Build to dry in the house. In those three days, our hope is to set the floors of the house, frame up the walls, set the trusses and put down the roof. With much coordination and a little help from the weather, drying in the home in three days is possible. The ultimate goal is to complete the house before the end of the year.

Thank you for your generosity to make a difference in our community. God's desire for us is to build God's kingdom on earth as it is in heaven. By your generosity, we are a step closer to seeing God's kingdom come.

This Sunday, we will celebrate Trinity Sunday as we consider what it means to be created in the image of God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. We will also celebrate the ordinance of baptism! See you on Sunday!

Family Ministry News

Thanks to everyone in our FBC family for your support and participation in the graduation festivities this past weekend. I was encouraged by the love and support you provided for our graduates.

This week, I would like to revisit the Growing Young core commitments. Thus far, I have talked about fueling a warm community and empathizing with today's young people. This week I would like to address the third core commitment: taking Jesus' message seriously. The writers of *Growing Young* defined this statement by describing three shifts that researchers found in churches that are successfully reaching young people.

First, the churches are less focused on abstract beliefs and more on Jesus. The Growing Young study found that young people care little for abstract theological ideas but are more drawn to the person and work of Jesus. Young people want to know what it means to be a disciple. They are not asking for easy grace. They desire a church that will help them understand Jesus and what He wants for their lives.

Second, young people want to deal less with heaven and more about living life now. Instead of focusing on the steps to salvation, young people want to know how they are called to live out their faith in community. They are drawn to churches that are actively involved in doing this.

Finally, young people want churches with less dogmatic certainty and more authentic honesty. During their study, researchers found that at least 70% of those interviewed experienced significant doubt concerning faith. The successful churches created a safe environment to talk about doubt and struggles. They also found two things to be true about openness: 1) Those honest about their struggles were more likely to read the Bible and 2) Doubt is not toxic when it comes to faith, silence is.

Let us consider these findings and see how we can help our young people take Jesus' message seriously.
