Fuller Youth Institute found that churches that are growing young are intentional in their focus on the young people. You can see these priorities in every part of the church. Even something as mundane as the budget creates a clear picture of those things that are important to the church. At the Growing Young seminar in March, Brad Griffin put it this way, “Budget does matter because it is a manifesto of your priorities.”

Is your worship time and Wednesday night activities designed in a way that prioritizes your families? Does your church seek out ways to help young people take load-bearing roles or is it just interested in entertaining? These are the tough questions that this core commitment forces you to ask.
