From the Desk of Andy Jung...

Once, on being asked by the Pharisees when the kingdom of God would come, Jesus replied, "The coming of the kingdom of God is not something that can be observed, nor will people say, 'Here it is,' or 'There it is,' because the kingdom of God is in your midst." (Luke 17:20-21)

The kingdom of God is in our midst. When Jesus spoke of the kingdom, it was mostly in the present tense, meaning that the kingdom is among us. Though it will be fully consummated when Jesus returns, God's kingdom exists today. As followers of Jesus, we are to help bring about God's kingdom by demonstrating Christ-like actions and attitudes.

Over the last three years, we have been intentional about getting out of our pews and being in our community, in our nation and around the world. We experienced God's kingdom in Cusco, Peru. We met God's people and joined God in the work he is doing there. We were all encouraged by what we experienced.

God is also at work in our own community through our fellowship. Our partnership with Habitat for Humanity is ready to hit the ground running. We will be working to "dry in" the home next weekend (Aug. 17-19) followed by weekly work inside and outside of the home. Volunteers will be needed for the next several months to complete the building project.

In addition, the Missions Committee has been in conversation with the leaders at East Albemarle Elementary to see how we can support the students and staff. As an initial step, we will host a staff luncheon on their first Teacher's Work Day on August 21 at noon. We are hoping to support East Albemarle in other ways throughout the school year to build God's kingdom right here in Albemarle.

Over the last several months, many of you have helped to make dresses and have donated items to help meet the goal of 500 Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes. Bob & Olivia Sweet, Jane Myers and Patty Edwards have been diligent in leading this special

ministry. Please make note that our OCC Packing Party will be on Wednesday, September 13 immediately following our fellowship meal.

Furthermore, the Missions Committee has been exploring how we can be long-term partners with Rob & Amanda Rone who are missionaries in Myanmar. The specifics are still being worked out but we can continually support this special couple through our prayers. In the next few weeks, I will share some specific prayer concerns for Rob & Amanda and for their ministry.

As your pastor, I am proud to work alongside you in building God's kingdom. It is a privilege to see God accomplish his work in us and through us. May it continue to grow.

This Sunday, we will continue with part two of "What is Grace?" sermon series. We will take a closer look at how our faith and works are connected to grace. See you on Sunday!
