## Words From Pastor

Over the last two years, we have been heavily involved in the Sticky Faith initiative at First Baptist. As you might remember, Sticky Faith focused on how we as a church can help our young people hold on to their faith as they graduate from high school. We have been working to build intergenerational relationships with one another to provide our students with adult relationships outside of their parents. We've also been working to involve them in the whole life of the church rather than just one or two segments of the church. Through it all, we are praying that our youth will have the solid foundation of faith that will last into their adulthood.

Sticky Faith has been focused on the individual lives of each child and teenager in our church. I believe the next step for our church to experience vitality is to begin focusing on how we as a church can impact not only the youth but also the young adults. Our church leaders will be engaging in conversations on how our church can grow younger through a study called Growing Young. The deacons have begun reading through the *Growing Young* book to not only see the current realities but also determine what shifts we might be able to make in the near future.

In addition, a Growing Young Leadership Team (myself, Alyssa Queen, Daniel Brown and Jane Myers) is being trained to think critically about some core principles that have effectively demonstrated to minister to young people. This leadership team will participate in a learning community to develop a strategic plan for our church to better minister to and with the young people in our church and community.

I truly believe that First Baptist has been placed in the heart of Albemarle for such a time as this. In the next decade, with the coming of the masters level programs through Pfeiffer, we will see an influx of young adults in our downtown. According to Pfeiffer leaders, the average age of the incoming students will be 27. We are well positioned to connect with these students and many others in our area. Yet, we cannot take the position that they will simply join our community of faith because of proximity. We must be prepared to love them well and help them to love God and love one another. This is my prayer for us. I hope you will join me in this prayer.

This Sunday, we will celebrate the heritage of our lay leaders who have shaped the way for our church in the past. I think it is appropriate to honor those who invested so much in our church so that we can look forward to what God has for us in the future. May it inspire us to continue the work of God's kingdom. See you on Sunday!

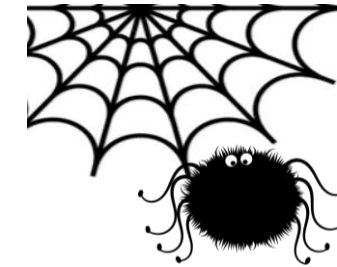
### Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes
