Words From the Pastor

This year's Super Bowl will be on Sunday, Feb. 4th between New England Patriots and Philadelphia Eagles in Minneapolis, MN. Over 100 million people will watch the big game and over \$15 billion will be spent in connection to the game. In beer sales alone, Americans will spend over \$600 million for the Super Bowl. According to National Retail Federation, an average of \$82.19 per viewer was spent on food, décor and team apparel for last year's Super Bowl. To be sure, the Super Bowl is big business!

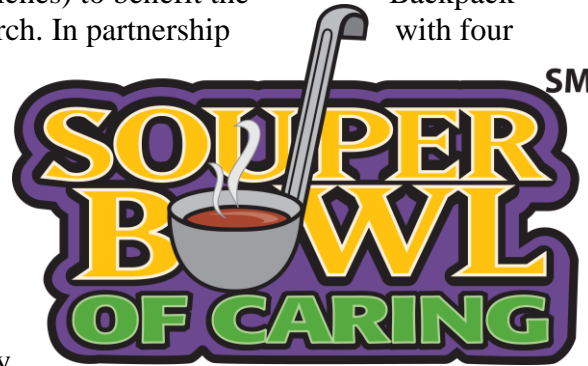
28 years ago, several churches in Columbia, SC began a movement that has mushroomed to national recognition. Marketing off the biggest game of the year, the combined youth groups started Souper Bowl of Caring to educate people about hunger and homelessness in their community. In addition, they raised \$5,700 and held food drives to support local ministries that help those in need that first year. Since then, the Souper Bowl of Caring movement has raised over \$135 million for local ministries and has raised awareness for the hungry and the homeless.

The beauty of the Souper Bowl of Caring movement is that the money raised stays in the local community. No money is sent to a central location. Each group who participates determines which ministry will benefit from the fundraiser or how the money will be used.

Our youth will hold a fundraising **Souper Bowl of Caring**

Luncheon (soup and sandwiches) to benefit the Backpack Buddies ministry of our church. In partnership with four

other local churches, we provide 30 elementary students at East Albemarle with food each weekend. The money raised from the Souper Bowl of Caring Luncheon will make sure these kids have proper nutrition while they are away from school.



Everyone is invited to the luncheon immediately following the worship service on **Sunday, February 4**. Our youth will help prepare the meal and will be serving as the wait staff during the luncheon. We encourage everyone to donate the amount of money they would've spent going out to lunch at local restaurants.

This Sunday, we will continue our series on Transformational Teachings of Jesus. Jesus said to "turn the other cheek." How is this possible? Let's talk about it on Sunday. See you there.

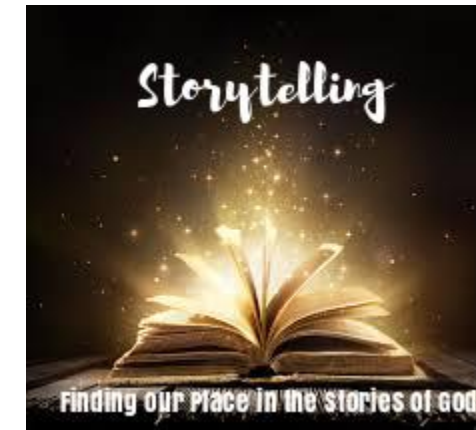
