## Words From the Pastor

In Rwanda, rural medical clinics are so isolated that deliveries cannot be made by trucks or motorcycles. Storage facilities are inadequate for the blood that is required for emergency transfusions, especially during childbirth. So, airplane-style drones now carry blood to these rural clinics. They save lives by airlifting blood to where it needs to be.

Zipline International, based in San Francisco, has developed this innovative system of blood distribution. Zipline is creating a set of hubs that can reach every health clinic in Rwanda by a drone delivery flight of 45 minutes or less. By the end of this year, two drone bases will cover the entire country, which is about the size of Massachusetts. Here is how it works: After a clinic sends its order for blood via text message, a drone takes off and is guided to its drop site by a military-grade GPS system. Each base has 15 drones and is responsible for as many as 150 flights to rural health clinics each day.

Zipline believes that this kind of drone delivery system will become a normal part of health care in Rwanda and elsewhere. The company also wants to begin the delivery of vaccines and medicine for malaria and HIV / AIDS in addition to its blood drops. Other companies are interested in using its technology for their own purposes, such as delivering snacks. But Zipline says no. The company is totally focused on "serving health care systems," says Zipline's cofounder. "Every delivery you make is potentially saving a human life."

Sometimes, this is the way we want our relationship with Jesus to work. We want the blood of Jesus to cover our mistakes when we are in trouble. We want Jesus to drop in when we need Him but not stay too long after the crisis has passed. We want to drop into church every once in a while to get "clean" and to get our tanks filled but we don't want to

truly invest in a relationship that will eternally change our lives. We sometimes would rather have a genie in a bottle rather than a Savior.

Yet, the life, death and resurrection of Jesus reminds us that Jesus is exactly who he said he was. He is the Son of God. He is our Messiah. He is our Savior and Lord. He is our Master and friend. He is the Lover of our souls.

In the Christian faith, Easter is our Super Bowl, Final Four, Masters Sunday, and 7<sup>th</sup> game of the World Series all wrapped into one! Christ's resurrection is the climax of God's story, the Greatest Story Ever Told! We should shout, cheer, scream and dance for victory is ours! True LIFE is possible because of Jesus! So, let's celebrate! Let's gather together on Easter Sunday to praise the name of Jesus. Let's share with the world all he has done for us! Praise God from whom all blessings flow! See you on Sunday!
