Words From the Pastor

Last fall, the Hurricane Irma skirted by the tiny island of Puerto Rico causing extensive damage and power loss to one million people. Shortly after Irma, Hurricane Maria made a direct landfall on Puerto Rico as a category four hurricane with sustained winds of 155mph. Needless to say, it devastated the island. Puerto Rico suffered catastrophic damage, including destruction of its previously damaged electrical grid. Over four million people lost power. For weeks in Maria's wake, most of the island's population suffered from flooding and lack of resources, compounded by the slow relief process.



As a response to the multitude of needs for the people of Puerto Rico, we raised over \$12,000 during our 2nd annual missions golf tournament to send to North Carolina Baptists on Mission to help with the ongoing disaster relief. Now, we are sending a small mission team to help the people of Puerto Rico rebuild.

A team of 11 people will leave this coming Sunday (April 15) and will return on Saturday, April 21. Through the ongoing partnerships with NC Baptists on Mission and Primera Iglesia Bautista de Rio Piedras in San Juan, the team will replace roofs on homes that were devastated by the hurricanes last fall. We will sleep and prepare our meals at the church. The team looks forward to representing First Baptist as we work to build God's kingdom.

What can you do? We need your prayers. Pray for the people of Puerto Rico as they continue to struggle to rebuild. Pray for each member of the mission team. Pray for safety on the job sites and for hearts of servanthood throughout the week. Prayer is powerful, and God desires to hear his people pray. So, let's pray!
