Words From the Pastor

Two years ago, we adopted a strategic plan that focused on three things: better understanding health & wellness, being family of families and learning more about hospitality. We have made great strides in all three areas but as always, there is more to do.

Last week, I shared about how our hospitality to some of the Pfeiffer students have created a welcoming spirit in our congregation. It made an impact on their lives. One of them specifically wrote a note that said how it gave her a feeling of family! This is what a community of faith should be! I belong. You belong. We belong to each other.

Jennifer Guerra Aldana, a colleague of mine, recently wrote in a blog post of what it means to be a family of families. "To be family means that there is an interconnectedness in our joys and laments. To be family means we know what keeps the other up at night and it becomes ours to hold with them. It means we know how best to care for one another when we are sick, what kind of food to bring after a long day, and how to cheer the other one up. It means showing up when it matters and holding the silence when words are not enough. To be family also means we practice mutuality. It is a two-way street. I bring all I am to the table, you do the same, and we share all we bring. It means that in a world of vast differences, we can engage the diversity among us as gifts that equally shape one another. Mutuality means I do not try to conform others to be like me, but that I receive their uniqueness as they receive mine. Mutuality is an invitation for mutual transformation, not manipulation."

I like how she defines family. Interconnectedness and mutuality are important in the church. We come together as unique individuals to give of ourselves to one another and live life together.

As we enter into summer, we can sometimes feel disconnected due to vacations and other travels. However, we need each other in the summer as much as we do any other times of the year. This means that we have to be more intentional about staying connected. Who can you ask over for dinner? Who can you invite to go on a walk? Who can you go visit?

This summer, let's be more intentional about staying connected as a family of families. Take advantage of the time we do have and catch up with people who you have missed or who you do not know as well. Be the CHURCH!

This Sunday, we will continue the series on The Life I Want to Live as Rev. Jacob Waldrip fills the pulpit. We will also hear what God is doing through Molly Peele and other missionaries in Rhode Island. We will also honor our fathers and father figures in recognition of Father's Day. See you on Sunday!
