Introduction: Captures audience attention and establishes the major theme of the speech.					
<b>5 Points:</b>					
Development: Ideas presented, supported and explained in clear logical order with smooth transitions.					
<b>5 Points:</b>					
Conclusion: Emphasizes major theme in the speech, leaving the audience with a clear, concise message or point of application.

<b>Delivery: 50%</b>					
<b>10 Points:</b>					
Clear enunciation of words. Limited use of unnecessary expressions (i.e.: "uh, you know, ok, like").					
<b>10 Points:</b>					
Good vocal projection, voice expressiveness, tone and pace.					
<b>10 Points:</b>					
Good eye contact and rapport with the audience.					
<b>10 Points:</b>					
Relaxed yet commanding use of posture and gestures.					
<b>10 Points:</b>					
Ability to captivate and/or move the audience
