

High School Curriculum Map

The North Fork School offers full-year English, History, and Mathematics courses for Middle and High School students. As one semester is not adequate time to prepare students for college-preparatory work, The North Fork School does not offer semester-only course options.

All North Fork School classes comprise mixed grade levels. Students are placed according to their academic needs, not according to age or class requirements. Students who attend McCall-Donnelly High School may take some classes out of order for their grade level, as every North Fork class contains mixed grades.

Students who stay with North Fork School classes throughout their high school years find that they are extremely well-prepared for college course work. Often their papers are used as examples by college professors to show how work should be done, and college classmates from public and private high schools ask our students for editing help.
