

Salvation From All 3 Aspects of the Sin Problem

On the following pages there are three columns related to the three aspects of sin that we need salvation from:

1. The wages of sin - death
2. Our slavery to sin;
3. All the evil effects of sin.

Each column contains verses from the Bible that explain what God has done, is doing, and will do to save us from all aspects of the sin problem.

Disappointments and misunderstandings occur when we focus on just one part of the plan of salvation and fail to see the whole picture.

For example, many people get angry at God for allowing bad things to happen on earth. The truth is God promised freedom from all pain and death only after He returns to earth and brings a complete end of sin.

Some people think there couldn't be a God of love when there is so much suffering on earth. The opposite is true. When Adam and Eve ate from the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil, God had three choices.

1. He could have prevented them from experiencing evil. If He did that, we would be like robots who didn't have freedom of choice. However, love never forces anyone to love and obey them.
2. He could have let them die and not created a plan of salvation.
3. He could take the initiative to save the human race from the wages of sin and restore the freedom of choice to every person.

When we understand that Jesus took the initiative to save the human race from the wages of sin, we will recognize what our choices are: Do we want to be reconciled to God and receive Him just as He is, our Savior and Lord? Or do we want to cling onto a life of sin and selfishness?

Misunderstanding what Jesus accomplished for the whole world has led many to think that getting eternal life is our greatest need. "Getting saved" and helping others "get saved" becomes their main focus.

But the good news is so much better than that. Jesus took the initiative to love, redeem, and save us before we did anything.

Ephesians 2:4,5 - "God, who is rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, even when we were dead in trespasses, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved). . ."

Romans 5:6-10 - "When we were still without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly. . . . God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from wrath through Him. For if when we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life."

1 John 5:10,11 - "He who believes in the Son of God has the witness in himself; he who does not believe God has made Him a liar, because he has not believed the testimony that God has given of His Son. And this is the testimony: that God has given us eternal life, and this life is in His Son."

When God gave Jesus to the world, He earned eternal life for everyone. If we don't believe that, John says we call God a liar. So the real question for each person is simple. "Do I want to be reconciled to Jesus. He has accepted me just as I am. Do I want to accept Him just as He is, a loving Savior from all aspects of the sin problem. Can I trust Him to be the Lord of my life and to always know what is best for me."

The only reason anyone will be lost in the end is because they choose to love sin. "This is the condemnation, that the light has come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil. For everyone practicing evil hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his deeds should be exposed." John 3:19,20.

When Jesus returns, they would rather die than live with Jesus forever (Revelation 6:14-16). Out of love, God will honor their choice and they will perish, for he will never force Himself on anyone (John 3:16).
