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SUBJECT: Proposal for Services with Monterey County Aquatic Team: ACTION

ATTACHMENTS: Monterey County Aquatic Team Proposal

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the proposal for services with the Monterey County Aquatic Team (MCAT) for the 4th grade Water Safety Program.

ANALYSIS: MCAT provides swim lessons and water safety instruction to all SCESD fourth grade students and students in Special Day Classes. Fourth grade students receive 30 minutes of instruction in per day for five days, and our Special Day Class students receive 45 minutes of instruction per day. In addition to lessons in basic swimming skills, students receive classroom instruction on safe behavior in and around water with the “Longfellow Tales” program produced by the American Red Cross.

FISCAL IMPACT: Funding is provided by Local Control Funding Formula Supplemental and Concentration funds. The cost is \$11 per student, for an estimate of \$16,137.

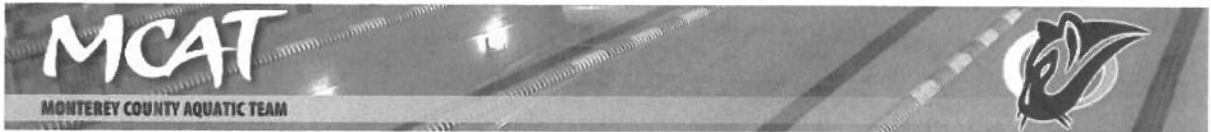
PROGRAM IMPACT: For many SCESD students it provides their first opportunity to feel comfortable in and around water, and to learn the basic swim safety skills of floating and dog paddling. Core instructional schedules are interrupted during the week of swimming, but teachers reconfigure their schedules to ensure that critical core instruction continues.

SwimAmerica Water Safety Lessons

Description

The Monterey County Aquatic Team and SwimAmerica swim lessons would like to provide swim lesson and water safety instruction to the fourth grade students in the Salinas City School District. The students will take a one week course and will learn important and valuable water safety skills.

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Objective

The fourth grade students in the Salinas City Elementary School District are in need of swim lessons and water safety instruction. SwimAmerica and the Salinas Aquatic Center will provide structured, quality lessons to the fourth grade participants.

Goals

The goals of SwimAmerica and the Monterey County Aquatic Team are...

- Provide structured, quality lessons to the Fourth grade participants
- Teach lifesaving water safety skills such as “Jump in, Float on Back, Yell for Help”
- Divide the students into appropriate skill level groups and instruct them on proper technique
- The students will engage in various scenarios to prepare them for real life emergencies

Terms

- The courses will be offered to Fourth grade students in the Salinas City Elementary School District.
- The class will last one week, Monday through Friday, for thirty minutes. If any week is only four days long, the cost will be prorated.
- The classes must have a minimum of twenty-five students. Each Fourth grade class will have a separate thirty minute session.
- All students **must** wear proper swim attire. No street clothes may be worn in the pool (i.e. jeans, basketball shorts, cargo shorts, undergarments, t-shirts, or leotards).
- It is the responsibility of the Salinas City Elementary School District and its teachers to ensure that proper swim attire is worn
- Students will arrive at pool already dressed in their swim attire. No locker room will be used before class starts.
- It is the responsibility of the Salinas City Elementary School District to inform the schools of the updated swim attire provision
- Students must follow the directions of the instructors, lifeguards on duty, and personnel of the Salinas Aquatic Center.
- Students will shower off on deck and will be limited to **5 minutes** in the locker rooms. If a student cannot change in the allotted time frame, he/she is at risk of losing the subsequent days of participation
- The Salinas City Elementary School District will be responsible for any damages done to the facility, including locker rooms, bleachers, pool, and pool equipment

- The participants must have a waiver signed by their legal guardian before entering the pool.
- Free time will only be offered on Fridays after the conclusion of the teaching. This is to ensure that the most amount of time is used on water safety skills as possible
- Per Monterey County Aquatic Team insurance and coverage, the diving board will not be used
- Salinas City Elementary School District agrees to provide transportation to and from the scheduled water safety classes, as well as supervision during transportation, and to indemnify and hold harmless MCAT employees, volunteers, and agents
- Salinas City Elementary School District is liable for all acts or inaction of its employees, agents, or volunteers

Fees

The Salinas City Elementary School District will pay to the Monterey County Aquatic Team \$11.00 per participant. This fee includes the addition of one lifeguard staff member to assist in monitoring the locker rooms.

Proposed Schedule

The schedule will be 14 weeks long; one week for each school (13) and one week for the SDC classes (1). The schedule is pending confirmation of school calendar and vacations. The District is responsible for assigning a school to each week.

A designated class time will be assigned to each class. The class times will be:

First Class: 9:30am

Second Class: 10:00am

Third Class: 10:30am

Fourth Class (If needed): 11:00am
