Dining Car China Ware

• China:

- Most railroads featured their own exclusive designs on their china, while others used a stock pattern.
- The railroad name, or initials appeared on the topside, or they were backstamped, along with the manufacture's name.
- Example: Large Service Plates, Quarter Service Plates, demi sets, butter pats, footed egg cups.




