

Candy Cane Cover

Design inspired by a vintage ornament

NECESSITIES

Material list is for making one cover. Select and cut body parts necessary for desired style

- 5" square wool felt (for body and ears)
- 3" x 4" rectangle (for main and eyes)
- 2" x 3" rectangle (for unicorn horn)
- 1-½" square (for giraffe horns)
- ⅞" diameter google-eyes, sequins, beads, buttons, embroidery floss, or magic marker for eye embellishment
- Tulip Snow 3D Paint (optional for unicorn horn embellishment)
- Fabric glue stick
- Small, fabric scissors
- Air-solvable marking pen

Read through all instructions before beginning. Use a ⅛" seam allowance throughout unless otherwise stated.

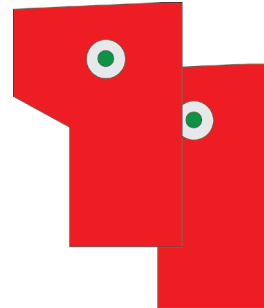
PREP

Check that the templates are printed full size by verifying that the reference square measures exactly 1". Cut out the templates neatly along the black lines.

Trace the templates on the wrong side of the desired fabrics. Follow the directions on the template to cut shapes and number of shapes. Cut the shapes out on the drawn lines. Use the air-solvable pen to transfer eye placement markings onto the right side of the fabric.

ASSEMBLE

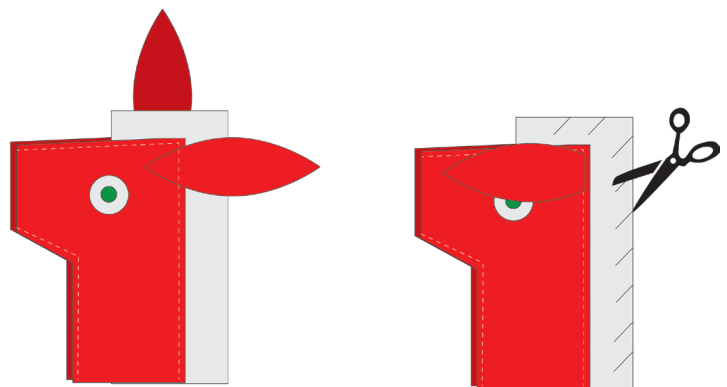
1. Glue the eye circles in place where marked on the right side of each body piece. Glue or sew desired embellishment to the center of each eye.



2. Place two body pieces, wrong sides together, matching edges. Sandwich the main rectangle ⅞" to 1" in from the long straight edge on the body and with bottom edge even with neck edge of body. Pin. Position ears on each side of body with tip of ear extending at least ½" in past the edges of the body. Pin or glue the tip of the ear to the body to hold in place while stitching.

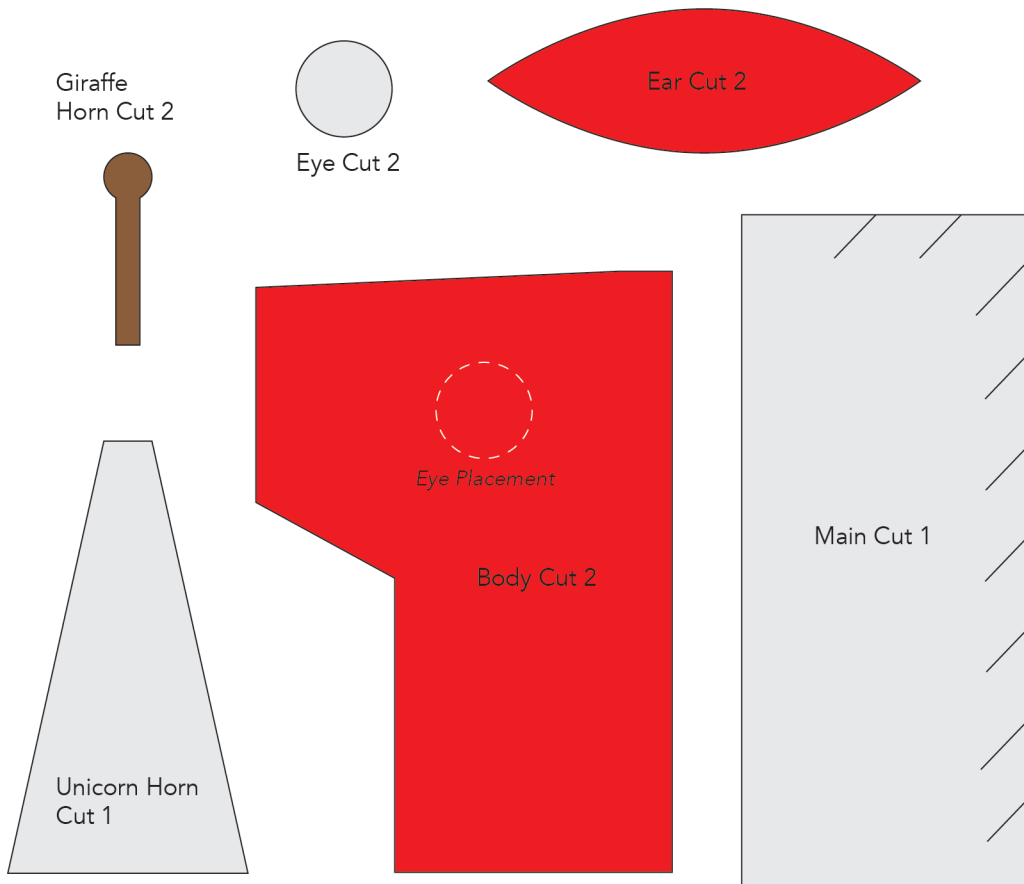
3. Starting and stopping with a backstitch, begin sewing at the end of the nose, across the top of the head, pivot at the corner with the needle in the down position, and continue down the long straight back edge. Stitch a second seam starting at the chin, pivot at the corner with the needle in the down position and continue down the front of the neck. The nose and base of the neck will be left open.

4. Pinch the ears forward onto the body and hold in place, out of the way. To give definition to the main, carefully snip diagonal slits as shown on the template.



5. Insert a candy cane through the opening in the base of the neck, turning the hook of the candy cane through the opening in the nose.
