

## Cactus



#### **CUT**

#### ·Fabric A

- » Two 4-%" squares cut in half diagonally
- » Four 2- $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6- $\frac{1}{8}$ " rectangles
- » Four 2-½" squares

#### •Fabric B

» Four  $2-\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6-\frac{1}{8}$ " rectangles

#### ·Fabric C


» Four 2-½" squares

#### Fabric D


» Two 4-%" squares cut in half diagonally Read through all instructions before beginning. Remove selvages. Cut pieces exactly as listed in instructions. Sew pieces right sides together and use an accurate  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.

#### **Rectangle Units**

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each  $2-\frac{1}{2}$ " fabric A square. Noting orientation of the drawn line, place a marked square right sides together on a corner of a  $2-\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6-\frac{7}{8}$ " fabric B rectangle as shown. Sew just outside the line on the corner side to keep the unit square. Trim  $\frac{1}{4}$ " past the sewn line. Press to dark fabric.



2. Noting orientation of the seam and using the straight edges and  $45^{\circ}$  marking on a ruler, cut the opposite end of the rectangle diagonally, creating an angled end parallel to the stitch line. Makes one A/B rectangle unit. Unit should measure  $2-\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6-\frac{7}{8}$ ". Make a total of four A/B rectangle units.



3. In the same manner as in Steps 1 and 2 and noting the mirror image of seam/diagonal edge orientation, make a total of four A/C rectangle units. Press seams toward the dark fabric.



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

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
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#### **BLOCK ASSEMBLY**

1. Referring to the Block Assembly Diagram and noting placement and orientation, sew one large fabric A triangle, to one A/B rectangle unit to make a quarter section. Repeat with one A/C rectangle unit, and one large fabric D triangle to make a second quarter section. Make four quarter sections.



2. Sew two quarter block sections together to make a half block. Make two half blocks. Note: Handle half-block carefully to keep from stretching the long bias edge.
