What We Know

Across the U.S. and the state of Colorado, cities are moving towards clean & affordable renewable electricity. As part of their climate strategy, the city of Boulder has committed to achieving 100% renewable electricity by 2030; Pueblo has committed to achieve 100% by 2035. Nederland just became the 42nd city in the U.S. with a commitment to 100% renewable electricity, joining the likes of cities with similar commitments like Atlanta and Salt Lake City.

Our Mission

To support the city's current Climate Action Plan, and also push Fort Collins to increase the pace of its emissions reductions by setting a goal of 100% clean renewable electricity by 2030. In this process we hope to voice the strong community support for clean energy, and create better communication and cooperation between community members, the city, and our utility.

Our Vision

To form a broad coalition of community organizations, businesses, and community stakeholders, with the intention of finding solutions to create a Fort Collins that runs on clean, renewable electricity. To work with the broader *Northern Colorado Partners for Clean Energy (NCP4CE)* coalition that is actively pushing for 100% renewable electricity regionally.

Next Steps

In addition to rallying public support around a move towards 100% clean renewable electricity in Fort Collins, the *FCP4CE* has formed a technical working group to consult the coalition regarding the economic and technical challenges of the transition away from fossil fuels. We look forward to working together with the Platte River Power Authority, city officials, and technical experts in our community to identify and find solutions to these challenges.
