

Assembly Bill No. 49 Notification

Last September, the State of Nevada Department of Education released student achievement data and other school-level data to the public through an online state report card system. In December, the Department released a revised school performance framework using specific components of that data set to rate public schools across the state. Due to a state decision to eliminate new high stakes end of course examinations for high school in September, the Department of Education withheld official ratings of high schools under the new statewide system of accountability and only rated elementary and middle schools.

The revised school performance framework adopted awarded every traditional public middle school in East Las Vegas a rating as one of the two lowest ratings possible pursuant to the Department of Education's new statewide system of accountability. The Department awarded eight middle schools in Summerlin, Henderson, and the Southwest with the highest rating possible pursuant to the Department of Education's new statewide system of accountability. While the Department has yet to release a comprehensive statewide system of accountability for all schools, the partial data released has been determined sufficient for the purposes of Assembly Bill No. 49.

Effective July 1, 2017, Assembly Bill No. 49 requires written notification of school performance to the parent or legal guardian of each pupil enrolled in certain charter schools and requires certain charter schools to post written notification on the charter school's website regarding the statewide system of accountability. The full text of Assembly Bill No. 49 can be found on the Nevada Legislature's website at <https://www.leg.state.nv.us/> A notification must be provided under Assembly Bill No. 49 when schools are rated as one of the two lowest ratings and must include a list of other public schools that a pupil may transfer to if the pupil's parent or guardian so chooses.

As required, the table below lists Equipo Academy's school performance framework index score under the newest statewide system of accountability, as well as the scores of neighboring zone traditional public schools. Students zoned for these schools may always apply to enroll at Equipo Academy and the school is actively accepting applications for the next enrollment lottery. Similarly, Equipo Academy students and families have a right to transfer to the neighboring zone schools below and other schools in the Clark County School District at any time dependent on current zoning and following district enrollment procedures. Official statewide accountability ratings for high schools have not been released at this time.

Assembly Bill No. 49 additionally requires the governing body of certain charter schools to hold a public hearing within 30 days of sending out a required notice. At the hearing, the governing body will discuss actions and solicit feedback for continued growth and improvement based on the statewide accountability rating system. It is the goal of Equipo Academy to not only be one of the best public schools in East Las Vegas, but also in Clark County and Nevada. Accordingly, Equipo Academy invites all members of the Equipo Academy team and family for discussion of these goals at the next board meeting, February 5, 2017 at 6 p.m.. This is not a required monthly family event or meeting, but an open discussion for interested members of the Equipo Academy team and family.

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
