Read: Luke 24:1-12 and 2 Corinthians 5:16-21

According to research, male veterans are 24 percent more likely to commit suicide compared to the general population. Female veterans are twice as likely! The effect does not stop there. Children, whose parents commit suicide, are two or three times more likely either to attempt or die by suicide.¹

So, we are not to glorify war. Never ever. God never intended war. War is a part of this broken, fallen world. War is a part of human folly. War is a failure.

In the aftermath of the campaign in Gallipoli, 130.000 people were killed: 87.000 Turkish soldiers and 44.000 allied soldiers. 8700 of those killed were Australians.² But these were not only numbers. These were individuals with names and faces, with hopes and dreams. These were loved ones of other people waiting for them back home, no matter where home was.

No, we do not worship the god of war. We worship the God of peace and love. Jesus is not known as the prince of war; he is known as the Prince of Peace.

Jesus too suffered from the worst kind of violence to bring healing to a world that is divided and broken. As such, we worship the God who shows us love by sacrificing Himself on the cross for our sake. Likewise, we are to honour the sacrifice made by those who have served on our behalf for our freedom and safety. Their sacrifice reminds us of Jesus' sacrifice.

Yet death did not defeat Jesus. At the break of dawn, a new life was born.

This movement from death to new life is reflected in the 'bugle' calls that are parts of ANZAC commemoration. In the military, the bugle calls signify two important times. The Last Post is the last bugle call of the day. It signifies the end of the day. You may notice that the last note of the Last Post is a rising note. It is a symbol of hope for the next day. The Rouse, on the other hand, is the first bugle call of the day. In a worship service, it heralds the resurrection.³

It is this message of the new life in Christ that we are to share to those trapped in the power of death and destruction. It is the message of a new dawn after the darkest of night; of a new day after a long night.

As a community of believers, we are called to be the embodiment of the resurrection to those who have been broken by conflicts; to offer healing to wounds created by all kinds of conflict, either domestically or internationally.

As important, we are to become the instruments and messengers of peace wherever we are. This is who we are as a community. This is what we have been tasked to do as followers of the Prince of Peace.
