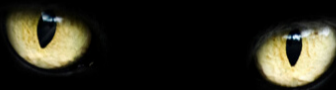

**On November 19th at 7pm in the Annenberg Auditorium of the Ford School, FemDems and JustDems, the women's issue and the social justice committees of the College Democrats, are hosting a panel on the topic of mass incarceration.**

The panel will feature multiple speakers representing varied perspectives on the effects and policies of mass incarceration in the United States, and will last approximately 90 minutes. We are writing to invite you and members of Students of Color of Rackham to attend.
