

#### **BETTER SCHOOLS** BETTER COMMUNITIES By Bob



Harvard studies shows that, second only to parents, teachers are the most important part of a child's education. Great teachers make a great difference in a child's life chances.

Case in point: Greta Jensen Tomic, who passed away peacefully this summer with her three children at her bedside. Greta graduated from Lawrence High School in Falmouth in 1949 and was proud to be class valedictorian. She attended Radcliffe College, graduating in 1953 with a BA in English Literature. At Radcliffe she met her husband, Fletcher Tomic, a student at Harvard, and they were married in 1952. The Tomics lived in our community for 35 years. Greta taught 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade for 25 years in the Carle Place School District. She loved theatre and directed many plays at Rushmore. She also loved her profession and excelled at it, earning a "Teacher of the Year" award and much praise from parents, students and colleagues. She had high regard for her fellow teachers at Rushmore, and for the CPHS music and theatre teachers. Bill Westcott, a fellow teacher, once said in awe, "I have never heard anyone say a negative word about Greta."Reading fiction was her passion, starting with Nancy Drew mysteries in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade and ending with all the major contemporary fiction authors of 2013. She was an active member and often the leader of three book groups. Greta loved The New York Times, which she read every day of her adult life, starting when

she first saw it in the library at Radcliffe at the age of 18. She was an avid crossword puzzle enthusiast, and an accomplished home cook. Greta is survived by her three children and their families. Betsy Tomic, Bill Tomic, and Jim Tomic were all outstanding students and athletes in our Carle Place schools and outstanding citizens in our community. Emanuel Raff, the Carle Place School District's first English Department Chairperson, passed away peacefully at 93 on July 17, 2013. He is survived by his wife of 65 years, Ruth, his sons Joshua and Hershel, and their families. Josh and Hersh were outstanding students and athletes throughout their K-12 experience in our schools and community. Manny was a quiet, thoughtful and dignified person who lived a long and rich life. He and Ruth loved to read widely, travel extensively and attend the theater, dance, lectures and art exhibits. He served admirably in World War II as an infantryman in the South Pacific, and was awarded a Bronze Star and a Purple Heart, among other commendations. After graduating from Montclair State Teachers College, he earned his M.A. from Columbia University and did post-graduate work at the University of Pennsylvania before starting his teaching career. 





*Fred* – Do I get you nervous, Rick? Be careful! Your shakes may develop into shingles. Get it, Mr. Fix-It? Shingles?





#### IT'S THE LAW

Under a law passed last year every homeowner that wants to receive the *Basic STAR* exemption on their primary residence and benefit with reduced real property taxes must register with the NYS Department of Taxation and Finance. Once registered, you will not need to re-register.

#### IF YOU DO NOT REGISTER, YOU WILL NOT RECEIVE YOUR BASIC STAR EXEMPTION.

Senior citizens who receive the Enhanced STAR exemption are not affected by the new registration requirement and nothing will change for them.

Why was this registration law passed?

This new Basic STAR registration law was passed to stop people from fraudulently obtaining multiple STAR exemptions. Breaking this law or providing false information may result in fines of up to \$2,500.00. So get it done on time in a fully truthful manner.

How do you register?

For property owners living in Nassau County the Codes necessary will not be available until mid-September 2013. Each homeowner will receive a letter that will tell you how, when and where to register and it will contain a "personalized code" that you will need to register on-line or on the telephone. If you



do not have a computer, call 518-457-2036. That line is answered between the hours of 8:00AM and 8:00PM Monday through Friday.

If you have a computer you can go to <a href="http://www.tax.ny.gov/pit/property/star13">http://www.tax.ny.gov/pit/property/star13</a> and register. But before you do you will need to have some information ready. In addition to the STAR code you will also need the name and Social Security number for each property owner. This includes any and all co-owners, including spouses.

What else do you need to know?

You can only have one Basic STAR exemption and it must be on your primary residence. That means married couples may have only one STAR exemption. The combined income of the owners, including spouses residing at the property may not exceed \$500,000.00.

Registration will continue to December 31, 2013. Try to avoid the New Year's Eve rush!

So get it done now while it is fresh in your mind. It's as easy as one, two, three!



#### BASIC STAR EXEMPTION REGISTRATION LEGISLATION

As a result of a law approved by the State Legislature, New York State is requiring that <u>ALL property owners</u> who currently receive the Basic STAR Exemption register with the Department of Taxation and Finance (www.tax.ny.gov) in order to receive the exemption for the 2014-2015 school year and subsequent years. This is for the Basic STAR Exemption only and does not pertain to those of you receiving the Enhanced STAR Exemption.

The following information has been provided to date:

- ★ The State will begin mailing renewal applications to North Hempstead residents September 9, 2013 through September 13, 2013. There may be as many as three separate mailings. (You cannot pre-register; please wait to receive your application in the mail.)
- ★ There will be two registration options, either by telephone or online (telephone number and website link will be provided on the application). Applications will contain a 7-digit STAR code number which you will use to register.
- ★ If you are registering online and cannot locate your 7-digit STAR code number, there will be a "Look Up" feature. Simply log onto the secure website and click on the drop-down arrow to select your county and town. Thereafter, enter the property address and your STAR code number will be provided.
- ★ The property owner will be required to provide his/her entire Social Security number. If multiple owners, each owner must provide his/her Social Security number. If applying online, only the last four digits of your Social Security number will appear.
- ★ Currently, the filing deadline is November 30, 2013 (subject to change; deadline will be shown on your paperwork from New York State).

Existing requirements will remain in effect:

- ★ The property must be your primary residence.
- ★ The combined income of the owner(s) and the owner's spouse who reside at the property cannot exceed \$500,000 for the 2012 tax year.

You should not hire a representative to complete your application to renew your Basic STAR Exemption. Additionally, be careful not to respond to emails or telephone calls from unknown sources requesting Social Security, date of birth and credit information.

Do not miss the opportunity to continue receiving this valuable exemption! Be vigilant...watch your mail in September for information from the New York State Department of Taxation and Finance. Be sure to register your property by the deadline on the application. We will provide additional information to all residential property owners as it becomes available.


