PLAY FOR MR. ORTEGA

All string players played for Mr. Ortega the first full week of school and the students now have a seating chart. The front stand of each section are the strongest players and their seats will stay the same. The remainder of each section has older students paired with less experienced students. Seats will rotate periodically.

The most advanced students were placed in the Honor String Orchestra which plays more advanced literature in addition to what we play in Concert Orchestra.
