Dear Oregonians,

As you may recall, you submitted a claim form in 2014 to recover money due to the court's preliminary approval of multi-state settlements worth \$310 million with all the major manufacturers of Dynamic Random Access Memory computer chips ("DRAM"). Enclosed in this letter is your reimbursement check. No really, there is a check! Your payment amount is based on the type and quantity of electronic devices you purchased, and the total number of claims made.

The multi-state settlements are a result of Oregon and 32 other states filing a complaint in federal district court against manufacturers of "DRAM" for conspiring to fix their prices in violation of antitrust, unfair competition and consumer protection laws. The settlement resolves those allegations by requiring the manufacturers pay \$310 million dollars to residents of Oregon and 32 other states.

The Oregon Department of Justice's Consumer Protection Division and I are committed to ensuring a safe and fair marketplace in Oregon. We will continue to seek out companies in violation of these laws to protect Oregonians.
