

For this part of the Tripping adventure you need to make two appliqué panels. You may choose your favorite method of appliqué.


## Tula Pink

## CUTTING

Using the template provided cut 17 "arch" shapes. Remember to add the seam allowance appropriate for your appliqué method.
From Background fabric cut strips of fabric at $51 / 2 "$ by various lengths and stitch together to create two borders
One will be $51 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ by $611 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
One will be $51 / 2$ " by $281 / 2$ "

## ASSEMBLY

Take the longer border and find the centre


Place 6 "arch" fabrics on either side of the centre mark
( 12 in total) making sure you have an even distribution and the color sequence you desire.
Remember to leave seam allowance at either end.



Next, take the shorter border and find the centre mark. This time you will find the centre of an "arch" and match this to the centre mark.


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Then stitch the remaining shapes either side. (5 arch shapes in total)


## These borders are stitched as follows:

- Short border between Sue Spargo's block and Sew Kind Of Wonderful's block
- The long border is stitched to the left hand side of the quilt top ( after JK, CF, and AMH panels are stitched together)
