Along the Oregon Coast - From Gold Beach to Coos Bay by Harvey Kupferberg

Opening Reception: Friday, June 7, 6-8:30pm



Some of these images represent 16 years of photographing the Oregon Coast. Initially B&W film was used to capture the coast's grandeur; examples of this work are made available. The works on display are color images which were photographed using digital cameras during the fall when fast moving storms and rain produce dramatic scenes. The southern Oregon coastline, from Gold Beach to Coos Bay, where these images were taken are 72 miles apart yet differ in many respects. Some beaches (Gold) are easily accessible, whereas other are dominated by cliffs and lighthouses (Coos Bay and Bandon). Sunrises, sunsets and tides continually change the visual palette.



Harvey Kupferberg spent 32 years at NIH in the field of medical research and he brings that discipline to his work. He has a bachelor's degree in chemistry, a doctorate in pharmacy and a doctorate in pharmacology. He is now retired, but it's that extensive background in chemistry that guides him in his experiments with exposure and development techniques. Harvey has won numerous awards and has had many solo and group exhibits in the DC region. Those awards do not come solely

from technique, but from that inexplicable something that clicks emotionally in both the photographer and the viewer.
