



Webinar: Health Care Providers Role in Identifying and Responding to Older Victims of Abuse

Overview: Health care providers are in a unique position to identify and respond to elder abuse. Dr. Veronica LoFaso, a geriatrician at Weill-Cornell Medical College in New York City, will discuss signs of elder abuse and neglect and how health care providers can identify and respond to potential older victims. Dr. LoFaso will also describe how victim service providers and other professionals can engage health care providers to work collaboratively with them. In addition, she will describe the important role health care providers can play on multidisciplinary case coordination teams.

About the presenter: Veronica LoFaso, MD, MS practiced for 10 years as an Adult Nurse Practitioner before returning to medical school at Albert Einstein College of Medicine. She is currently a practicing clinician as well as director of Medical Student Education for the Division of Geriatrics and Palliative Medicine at Weill Cornell Medical College. Doctor LoFaso is a member of the steering committee for the New York City Elder Abuse Center and sits on two multidisciplinary Elder abuse teams in Brooklyn and Manhattan. Her area of research is elder abuse forensics.
