Thursday, October 23, 2014

Read: Hebrews 3:1-6

Think:

- What is the implied question in these verses?
- How is that question answered in these verses?
- Write your answer to the two "think" questions above into a one sentence summary of verses 1-6:
- What does the word "therefore" in verse 1 indicate about this paragraph's relationship to the preceding paragraph?
- In verse 1, the recipients of this letter are described as "holy brothers and sisters." What does "holy" mean? How do these believers (or any believers) qualify to be called "holy?"

Friday, October 24, 2014

Read: Hebrews 3:1-6 again.

Think:

- This passage contains one command. What is the command and what verse is it found in?
- What do you think this command meant, in your own words, to the original audience?
- Verse 1 refers to the readers as "brothers and sisters, who share in the heavenly calling..." What do you think the "heavenly calling" is?
- Verse 1 says that "we acknowledge [Jesus] as our apostle and high priest." What do the titles "apostle" and "high priest" communicate about Jesus?

Saturday, October 25, 2014

Read: Hebrews 3:1-6 again.

Think:

- Verse 2 describes Jesus as "faithful to the one who appointed him." In what ways was Christ "faithful" in his role as an "apostle" (v. 1)?
- Verse 2 says that Moses was "faithful in all God's house." This is a reference to Numbers 12:7. Read Numbers 12:6-8. What, in the context of Numbers 12, was God saying when he called Moses "faithful."
- What do you think "God's house" in Numbers 12:7 is?
- Also in Numbers 12:6-8, Moses is compared to others who received God's revelation such as "prophets" (v. 6) and even Miriam and Aaron (vv. 1-2). What does Numbers 12:6-8 suggest about Moses' faithfulness when compared to others? Is he more faithful, less faithful, or as faithful as the others?
- Since Numbers 12 indicates that Moses is more faithful in receiving and communicating God's revelation than others, he can be a prime example of faithfulness. Back in Hebrews 3:2-6a, when compared to Moses is Christ more faithful, less faithful, or as faithful as Moses was?

Sunday, October 26, 2014

Read: Hebrews 3:1-6 again.

Think:

• Hebrews 3:2, Jesus is described as "faithful... just as Moses was faithful." Verse 5 describes specifically how Moses was "faithful." What did Moses do, according to verse 5b, that qualified him to be called "faithful?"

• If verse 2 says that Christ is faithful "just as Moses was faithful" and verse 5 describes Moses' faithfulness as revealing God's word, then what aspect of Christ's ministry is the author of Hebrews thinking about when he compares Christ's faithfulness to Moses' faithfulness? In other words, what was Christ also faithful to do?

Pray for today's worship service

- For God to be glorified in everything.
- For Pastor Brian to deliver a clear, biblical message.
- For the Holy Spirit to convict and apply His word as Pastor Brian preaches.
- For lost people to attend our worship service today and to understand the gospel message.

Monday, October 27, 2014

Read: Hebrews 3:1-6 again.

Think:

- Verse 3 compares the honor Jesus received to the honor that Moses received. The verse says that Christ was "found worthy of greater honor." What according to verses 3-4 made Christ worthy of greater honor?
- Verses 5-6 compare the faithfulness of Moses and Jesus in two key ways:
 - ▶ The first comparison uses the word "as" for both Moses and Jesus. What is the comparison? What does this comparison teach us about the difference between Christ and Moses in their faithfulness to God?

▶ The second comparison uses a different preposition for each person to describe that person's relationship to God's house. What is the comparison? What does it teach us about the difference between Christ and Moses.
