¹ **Minor changes** are not substantive, e.g. typographical, grammatical and syntactical errors. Final acceptance requires confirmation from the supervisor that changes have been made.

² **Modifications** If modifications are required, a committee (usually consisting of the thesis supervisor and a supervisory committee member) is struck to approve the revised thesis. Modifications must be completed by the student and approved by the committee within 3 months of the examination. Approval should be conveyed in writing to the graduate coordinator.

³ A second and final exam may be held within 3 months.
