MGY314H Principles of Genetic Analysis I

Undergraduate genetics laboratory course (one laboratory per week, Thursday afternoons).

Qualifications

Applicants will be considered on the basis of their familiarity with microbial genetics & must have completed an undergraduate laboratory course in this subject, or have gained equivalent experience through research project work. Further details about the Department's hiring policy are available in the Department & the CUPE office.

Duties

- Advanced preparation as required in consultation with the laboratory coordinator.
- Supervision of one group of no more than 24 students during each laboratory period
- Marking laboratory reports & problem sets

Hours of Work

The workload per week will be determined in part by the number of students in each laboratory group, but will be approximately 100 hours for the academic session.
