The Molecular Genetics Program seeks 1 Teaching Assistant for the following course:

MMG3001Y – ADVANCED HUMAN GENETICS

Human genetics from the perspective of phenotype / clinical presentation toward genotype with focus on molecular genetics and underlying mechanisms of human disease.

Qualifications

A background in genetics, genomics, and molecular biology is required. Preference will be given to applicants who can demonstrate excellent writing skills. First consideration will be given to full-time graduate students at the University of Toronto.

Duties

- Assignment research and preparation. This includes developing insightful, creative assignments based on provided reading and research material, as well as creating a thorough answer key to the assignments.
- Regular strategy and update meetings with course coordinator

Duties of this position can be performed at a location of the TA's choosing, as long as they have access to the course reading materials.

Hours of work: approx. 40 hours (average of 5 hours per week)

Estimated Course Enrolment: 20 students

Rate of Pay: SGS I/II - \$44.44/hour (+4% vacation pay)

Final availability of the position(s) is contingent upon enrolment, budgetary consideration and the determination of appointments as governed by the collective agreement.
