

London-based musician David Viner may only be 24, but he knows the blues. T've never cotton-picked a field, but I don't have good luck with women and most of my lyrics are about that.' Listen to his rich, laid-back voice, and it's clear that age doesn't matter. Viner picked up a guitar for the first time at 17, but five hours of daily practice and a job driving a tour lorry in 2002 for the Detroit band Von Bondies paved the way for his success. 'One night in Texas, their lead singer Jason pushed me on stage. I played from then on, alongside genuine bluesmen, and was spotted by a label.' His second album, This Boy Don't Care, is more country-influenced. and is set for critical acclaim. 'I wish I could say the same for my love life,' he grimaces. 'The lyrics on this are even more frustrated than on the first.' This Boy Don't Care (Loog) is released on 21 June
