More than 3,000 animals, including raccoons, foxes, beavers, opossums, skunks, owls, hawks, and songbirds come into our care each year to be treated for all types of injuries caused by non-natural events such as impact by automobiles, altercations with domestic animals, poisoning from pesticide use, and wounds caused by gun shots.
