Since 1975, first through R.C. Bigelow and Company and then directly, **David and Eunice** have supported the mission of the Norwalk Symphony Orchestra.

Their consistent commitment to our organization for the past 47 years has enabled the Symphony to continue to grow and thrive. We have been honored through the years as they joined us at the Concert Hall for performances and were able to enjoy the music they help to sustain.


Bigelow Tea can attribute its beginnings to David Bigelow's mother and the advent of "Constant Comment" in 1945. Yet it was David and Eunice who pioneered the explosion in specialty teas that Americans enjoy today. David, with the unwavering support of his wife Eunice, lead the company with integrity, passion, intelligence, kindness, and a spirit of determination to its current prominence as the country's #1 tea company.

In 1974, building on the success of "Constant Comment," the company introduced several new flavors creating a whole line of teas to help achieve greater prominence on the supermarket shelf. Another notable milestone in their luminous careers was the development of the foil pouch that has become the accepted industry standard for protecting tea's freshness and flavor from ambient influences.

The Bigelow family made a considerable investment in the preservation of the Charleston Tea Garden in South Carolina, saving it from the developer's wrecking ball and restoring it to its former grandeur as America's largest commercial farm. The farm's visitor center documents the tea growing, harvesting and withering processes, giving over 80,000 people who visit annually a new-found appreciation for this remarkable beverage.

The Norwalk Symphony is honored to continue its longstanding connection with **David and Eunice Bigelow** and the entire Bigelow family, and we congratulate them with our Forte Award.





Lou Broudy literally has the Norwalk Symphony in his genes. His father Bernard ("Steve") and mother Miriam both served on the board at different times while Lou was in Norwalk High School. Along with his younger brother Eric, he grew up in our audience, learning how great symphonic music can change lives. It has certainly changed his, and he has been a valued member of the Symphony's Board of Governors for 50 years!

Lou discovered the trumpet at Marvin Elementary School and joined the marching band when he entered Roger Ludlow Jr. High School, with his brother Eric later joining him on the clarinet. In high school (our current City Hall building) Lou played in the band and orchestra, played first trumpet for the all-city and all-state bands, and in his spare time formed his own dance band, the Four Beats. In his junior and senior years, Lou played with the Symphony under maestro Quinto Maganini. He then attended Cornell University where he played trumpet with the Big Red Marching Band during his four years.

Lou's performing career ended in 1960 when he entered the University of Virginia Law School, but his love of music has endured through his successful law career with several New York law firms, including

his own. In the late 1960's, Lou and his family moved to Weston, CT where he once again began attending Symphony concerts. His daughter Kate lives nearby in Weston and her older sister Berne lives near Burlington, VT with her husband Mike and three rescue dogs. Lou specializes in corporation and real estate law, and he continues his practice with Offit/Kurman in New York.

Lou joined our Symphony family in 1973 while sitting in the dentist chair of Manny Knishkowy, then a violinist with the Symphony. Manny asked him to join the board and Lou recalled, "I was in no position to refuse!" Thus began his tenure as our longest-serving board member. Lou has served the Symphony in many capacities during his 50 years—including on the Bylaws Committee, the Nominating Committee, as Vice President, as well as faithfully supporting the Symphony financially during his entire tenure.

Finally, lest you think that all Lou does is practice law and support the Symphony; he also loves scuba and sailing trips with his lovely wife Sylvia, taking long bicycle rides on Weston's back roads, and cruising on his Harley. We are so pleased to honor Lou for his lifetime love of music and the Norwalk Symphony!

Philip has appeared on many stages around the country, including New York, CT, and Minneapolis. He recently appeared in *Rocky Horror Picture Show* and *Sunset Boulevard* at Music Theatre of CT in Norwalk. For 16 straight years, he starred as George Bailey in *It's A Wonderful Life: A Live Radio Play* at the historic Saint Paul Hotel in St. Paul, MN. He has played Ben Franklin in *1776*, Bill Wilson in *Bill W. and Dr. Bob*, and more than 23 roles in an original play about the life of the beloved late Minnesota Senator Paul Wellstone. In NY, he was last seen off-Broadway in the NY Times Critic's Pick "Honky" at Urban Stages.

Philip also has a long career as a host, emcee, and auctioneer for nonprofit organizations, and has headlined gala events for social service agencies, schools, theatres, and many more. 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

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KEYS' mission is to provide free music lessons and performance opportunities to underresourced students of Bridgeport, CT. KEYS envisions a world where every child has access to the transformative experience

of studying and playing music regardless of circumstances.

Our "Music for Life" lessons program provides one-to-one instrument lessons taught by trained and experienced instructors to children whose families do not have the means to pay for music instruction. KEYS also provides instruments for students to use while enrolled in the KEYS MUSIC program. All our programs are free for Bridgeport students.

We have a unique in-school teaching model at 21 Bridgeport schools, and also a robust Saturday program with individual lessons plus non-audition ensembles for KEYS Orchestra, KEYS Concert Band, KEYS Chorus, and KEYS Jazz Band. We are pleased to partner with musicians from the Norwalk Symphony Orchestra who visit the KEYS Saturday program several times a year to provide individual and small group coaching for our ensembles.

The KEYS Jazz Band is comprised of students in grades 7-12 and is directed by KEYS Founder and Artistic Director Rob Silvan. The KEYS Jazz Band plays a variety of jazz standards with a focus on mastering jazz foundations, with opportunities to develop improvisation skills and gain performance experience.

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EDUCATION & YOUTH PROGRAMS



(Not) Just for Kids is a core music upcoming performances incorporated with STEAM concepts to teach students of all ages about the various instrument families

other related topics. Presented at after-school programs and local libraries, each ends with a "Petting Zoo" enabling attendees to try their hand at playing the instruments presented.

The annual Concerto Competition is an opportunity for students to test their musicianship with peers from the Fairfield County region. The environment is encouraging, with judges providing constructive feedback with an emphasis that aims to assist young musicians in improving



their skills. Learning to perform and compete are important elements of the performing arts, and this event helps to develop skills for young students to become great performers. The winner of the competition plays their solo piece with the full orchestra at our annual Music for All Ages concert each March.



The **Master Class Program** focuses on middle and high school students, and this marks our second year of developing this new grant-funded program. Working with our local high schools and two other nonprofit music

education programs, Symphony musicians and the conductor have presented specialized workshops to assist these young musicians in their playing and performing skills. Development of the format and expanse of this program is ongoing and we look forward to growing this new opportunity to work with young musicians.
