CROSSING INCIDENT

You may have heard that there was a child knocked over by a car on our school crossing last week. The incident happened around 4pm and involved a girl from another school. Thankfully the child escaped with minor grazes. The following morning we held a whole school assembly for the children and reiterated our rules for use of the crossing, the procedure for crossing the road and after hours supervision. Some parents of older children have made arrangements for their children to be collected from the store. This is acceptable while the crossing supervisor is there. Without prior notification from parents, children are not allowed to use the crossing before, during or after school. Children attending before or after school care are not able to go to the store before, after or during their time at OSHC. This is an important safeguard and we look for your support in maintaining these expectations.

VicRoads and the local Nillumbik Shire are both involved in a follow up investigation of the incident and we are looking to improve the crossing by whatever means are necessary. I will keep you posted of any developments.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students.




