# **Zentangling and Turning- Who Knew?**

What a show Alan and Lauren Zenreich put on last month! There was something different every minute to catch your attention – iphones and battery packs for video projection, special jigs and fixtures, and detailed turning and decorating techniques for <u>small jewelry items</u>, just to name a few. They also introduced us to <u>zentangling</u> – shown here at the top left. Lauren explained that Zentangling is

a "structured doodling," usually done with a micro-pen, where different shapes are filled with patterns. A web search will easily get you inspired and started.

There are probably few tools that Alan doesn't like, if they solve a problem or make work easier, such as the mop sander: handy to sand pendants. And forget regular sand paper; try instead Abranet sanding sheets, and keep them organized with a Velcro strip magnetically attached to your lathe! # **Ron Durr's Take on an Eccentric Chuck**

We think that if you show Ron Durr any tool you've just challenged him to make his own. And he did just that the very next day after he saw the Joyne Off-Center Jig or pendant backer at our last meeting. According to Ron, "If you watch the <u>videos</u> from Ruth Niles there are a few demos about the device which helped me visualize how to make this thing."

Shown here is his wooden version, but not including the mandrill to hold it in the Jacobs chuck on the lathe. Ron says "there are several ways to make a mandril, but I chose the easiest way using 1/2" steel, drilling it on the metal lathe to accept a 3/8-16 rod secured in with 5 minute epoxy."

Ron said after his first trial run, he needed to learn a lot more on how to use it. After his second try we think he will have completely figured it out. Ron also took advantage of the Zenreich's offer to answer any questions and located the source for a piece of the Picasso Fantasia (from Lakeshore Hardwoods). 
# The Zenriech's Offer These Ideas



If you've never heard of <u>zentangling</u>, click on this link and see the big world of what maybe you called doodling. You might even find it therapeutic!



Try zentangling on some jewelry or a vessel. Plain woods are a great canvas! Blick has Copic Mulitliner pens.



Did you know that the double stick tape needs pressure for 30 seconds to activate? Try a home made jam chuck for the job.



Here's a tool to hold small parts – a universal work holder or pin clamp from Micromark. It may just save your fingers!



Pendants like this can be made on an eccentric chuck. Buy it from <u>SS Niles</u> or <u>Steve Worcester</u> or be like Ron Durr and make your own.



How do you center an off-set hole to chamfer it's edge? Use the same bit you used to bore the hole in your tailstock.



This is beautiful wood – or a synthetic plus wood, made to look like wood. It is actually flooring called Picaso Fantasia, You can find out more about it and other woods they offer at Lakeshore Hardwoods. Or phone them at 1-315-298-6407in Pulaski, New York.



You've always heard it's all about connections, well if you are making jewelry you can take that literally. Laura Zenreich offered these sources: Rio Grande or JewelrySupply.com And to drill those little holestry Harbor Freight's solid carbide micro-bits in concert with a Dremel drill press and a micrometer stand. The soft jaws of the stand protect your work.
