Did You Know?

Jesus loved when the little children worshiped Him and so do we! We offer several ministries for you and your young ones during services that you can choose to take advantage of:

- **Attended Nursery** (up to 24 mo.)—Located down the children's hallway. You can drop off your child with an attendant or stay with him/her.
- **Un-Attended Nursery** (up to 24mo.) – Located at the center-back of the auditorium. You can sit with your child and listen to the service.
- **Nursing Room**— Located at the Northwest of the auditorium.
- **Training Room**— Located at the Southwest end of the auditorium.
- **Children's Bible Hour** – classes for ages 2/3 and 4yrs– 4th grade. Children can be dismissed after communion.

The Good Samaritan

It is thought that when Jesus shared this parable it was in a teaching circumstance. This is thought because the expert in the law stood up to ask the question which initiated Christ's response with this parable. Scripture tells us this man was an expert in the law which is a person who has made it his business to know and understand the details of the Jewish religion. This would mean he had studied the Scriptures, (the Old Testament, the Law, the Psalms, and the Prophets). He would have also been familiar with all of the traditions of the Jewish nation.

When he asked Jesus, "What must I do to inherit eternal life", he immediately revealed that he had little knowledge about central issues of the Jewish faith, eternal life, and the basic command to love one's neighbor. Jesus responded to the question with one of my favorite parables, "The Good Samaritan." This story contrasts the unloving actions of a Priest and Levite with the compassionate actions of a Samaritan. To the Jews, a Samaritan would often be referred to as a dog, an irreligious person.

In this story, the Samaritan's actions were exactly what should have been the response of the Priest and the Levite. His actions were extremely generous, and Jesus made sure to highlight his willingness to go beyond what most would have expected of him. The subtle message here may be the reality that generosity inspired by God can do so much more. One might be expected to cook a meal, but will also set the table and clean up when everyone is finished. This person will say grace, but also asks God's blessing on everyone present.

The idea here is that such people will always extend themselves. When they see a job to do, they will go far beyond what is expected. This serves as a great personal witness of Christ in one's life and often makes a bigger difference than could have been imagined. Jesus taught that love is shown by action, that it must not be limited by its object, and, at times, it is costly.

When we are confronted by the needs of others, it will bring out a variety of attitudes. Jesus knew this and used this story of the compassionate but despised Samaritan to make clear what attitude was acceptable to God. If most people are honest, they often will find themselves in the place of the expert in the law, needing to learn again who their neighbor is. Too often our neighbor is the one whom we are comfortable with, someone we know or is like us. Most of us struggle with anyone who doesn't fit our criteria.

Think about the different attitudes we see exhibited towards the wounded man.

To the expert in the law, the wounded man was something to be discussed.
To the robbers, the traveler was someone to take advantage of.
To the so called religious men, the man in need was a problem to be avoided.
To the innkeeper, the man in need was a paid customer, to serve for a fee.
To the Samaritan, the man left for dead was a human being who needed care and he responded appropriately.

Have you ever thought about Jesus' attitude in this story, Praise God, He felt all of them were worth dying for.
