Did You Know?

Jesus loved when the little children worshiped Him and so do we! We offer several ministries for you and your young ones during services that you can choose to take advantage of:

- **Attended Nursery** (up to 24 mo.)—Located down the children's hallway. You can drop off your child with an attendant or stay with him/her.
- **Un-Attended Nursery** (up to 24mo.) – Located at the center-back of the auditorium. You can sit with your child and listen to the service.
- **Nursing Room**— Located at the Northwest of the auditorium.
- **Training Room**— Located at the Southwest end of the auditorium.
- **Children's Bible Hour** – classes for ages 2/3 and 4yrs– 4th grade. Children can be dismissed after communion.

In Christ A New Day

Luke 21 gives Jesus' first century audience some pretty heavy and somewhat disturbing truths. Jesus' teaching of the future of Jerusalem must have sounded like something out of one's worst nightmare. It would have raised many legitimate questions, also. Why would God allow these kinds of horrible things to happen to His people and their city? In general, why would God allow bad things to happen to good people?

Those questions cannot be answered with complete assurance, but one can know the one who knows the answers to those tough questions. Perhaps eventually humanity, or at least the church, will understand why it had to endure trials and suffering. One thing we do know, and we've discussed it as we have been visiting the parables, is that God sees our pain, our fears, our losses, and he most certainly cares. God never totally abandoned his people and neither will He leave us.

Perhaps this is why Jesus answered their questions with the truth of His second coming and the parable of the fig tree. There will be things that will occur when Christ returns that will be undeniable as far as their cosmic origins. These will be things that will be scary but exciting for some, and for others it will be a time of complete terror and chaos. This teaching is meant to inspire hope in those who are informed of His return. As believers we have no excuse for being unprepared. We must commit ourselves to living ready, wholeheartedly obedient, and bathing everything in prayer.

Next, Jesus shares the Parable of the Fig Tree. This parable answers the question of when the events Jesus had just spoken of would occur. People knew when summer was coming by looking at the fig tree, and other trees also, but the transformation of the fig was very dramatic. Over the winter months its branches become very dry and brittle, so much so it has the appearance of a dead tree. As spring arrives the fig tree's branches become tender, filled with sap, and eventually bud. When the fig tree makes this transformation they knew summer was very near.

This is important because just as they could know the change of seasons by watching nature's signs, they could likewise know that when they see the things happening that Jesus had described earlier, they could be confident the kingdom of God was near. The second coming of Jesus, as well as a changed heart, are both certainties through Christ. His fulfillment of prophecies assured the disciples that all the prophecies He'd given here would also come true.

It doesn't take a lot of life to figure out that political trends come and go. Opinion polls change like the direction of the wind, and fashions come and go daily. Life's savings can be here today and gone tomorrow. Music groups can be on top of the world one day and forgotten the next. Every certainty the world values is temporal at best. Now contrast that with Jesus' words.

“Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will by no means pass away.”

In Christ, this is a new day, today and for eternity. Christ's return is not to be feared but expected.
